Diamond Valley Community Support Financial Assistance

Diamond Valley Community Support Financial Assistance Diamond Valley Community support (DVCS) is an independent not-for-profit organisation that provides direct aid, assistance, support and information for people who live in the Banyule City Council area and have an address showing on their Centrelink card in one of the following suburbs: Briar Hill, Bundoora (part of), Eltham North (part of), Greensborough (part of), Lower Plenty, Montmorency, St Helena and Watsonia.

DVCS services currently include a Back to School Program, which provides eligible families a cheque for \$100 per child (up to \$500 per family). The cheque will be made out to the school, and is to be used for educational purposes, i.e. Subject Contributions, camps, excursions, and so on. The program will close on 14th December 2018 and will recommence from Tuesday 8th January 2019. DVCS is located at Shop 378a Level 3, Greensborough Plaza. Ph: 03 9435 8282 / 03 9435 5440.

Banyule Council

We are so pleased that Banyule Council is proving support for a range of healthy initiatives at the school. The Council provided \$200 to support our Walk to School program and this has funded our Friday morning breakfast program for fourth term. Many thanks to Ethan in Grade Five who has efficiently set up and organised the breakfasts each Friday. He has shown great organisation and leadership and we are very appreciative of his commitment to helping the staff and other students in the school.

The Council is also sponsoring a 'Pedal n Blend' program on Friday 14th December where pedal power is used to make fruit smoothies for the students. In addition, the Council is providing a pedometer for each student which we will be distributing next year with some 'step' targets.

Banyule Council is also offering to provide Walk to School footpath signage for our students. To best understand where the signage would be most beneficial, the first thing we need to do is to pinpoint on a map where all of the students in the school live. Council will be proving an A3 map for each classroom where each student can put a dot of where their home is located (we're hoping the Prep/1/2 parents will be able to assist with this) Once we have this information we will be able to provide Council with the best locations for signage. There are other ideas 'on the table' such as our student leaders having the opportunity to meet with local councilors and present their ideas and suggestions. These are great initiatives that have the potential to greatly benefit our students and school community and we are very pleased to have the opportunity to work with Banyule Council on these programs.

Cake Stall

Thank you so much to those parents who have offered to provide baking for the Election Day cake stall. Baking can be left at the office on Friday or brought to the school on Saturday morning. A reminder that to comply with Council guidelines the baking needs to be labelled with the ingredients and there can be no fresh cream.



Some of the non-fiction books are even more costly.

Thank you to those people who have contacted me regarding lost books. I understand that books can be misplaced or left at other relative's homes. Please feel free to contact me if you have any concerns regarding your child's lost books.

If your child or family is leaving Greensborough Primary at the end of the year can you please return all of their books.
