## **Principal's Report**

Just a friendly reminder that as the year draws to an end we would like all library books returned to the library as soon as possible. Some of the non-fiction books are even more costly.

On Thursday the 29<sup>th</sup> of November the Prep-2 students enjoyed the RACV Street Scene Incursion with our safety educator Lisa. This program links with our Health unit and covers vital areas of safety as pedestrians, cyclists and passengers.



## Limitations children have in using roads safely:

- Children have a lack of knowledge and understanding of traffic and the road environment
- Their sight and hearing are not the same as adults
- Judging speed and distance accurately is difficult
- Some words and concepts are difficult to understand, such as "left/right" and "kerb/gutter"
- Concentration is limited to one thing at a time
- Perception, attention, memory and co-ordination are not yet fully developed





## Sciencemaker Faire – Polytechnic Excursion
