

Banyule Council and Road Safety Around Schools

Banyule Council has notified us of the actions they are taking to improve the safety of primary school students. Council has installed a variety of road safety treatments including traffic calming devices, line marking and parking restriction signs. Parking Officers have also been employed to enforce parking laws and monitor school crossings and surrounding areas. Camera mounted vehicles will also take photos of vehicles breaching parking rules and will subsequently issue infringement notices to owners. FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE INFORMATON FOR PARENTS

Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund (CSEF)

To be eligible for the fund you need to be a parent or legal guardian of a student attending Greensborough primary school in 2019, and:

- a) Be a holder of Veterans Affairs Gold Card or be an eligible Centrelink Health Care Card (HCC) or Pensioner Concession Card (PCC) holder, OR
- b) Be a temporary foster parent, and;
- c) Submit an application to the school by the due date

Parents who receive a Carer Allowance on behalf of a child, or any other benefit or allowance not income tested by Centrelink, are not eligible for the CSEF unless they also comply with one of (a) or (b) above.

For concession card holders CSEF eligibility will be subject to the parent/legal guardian's concession card being successfully validated with Centrelink on the first day of either term one (29 January 2019) or term two (23 April 2019).

Payment Amounts

The CSEF is an annual payment to the school to be used towards camps, sports and/or excursion expenses for the benefit of the eligible student to the value of \$125 per year. The CSEF is paid directly to your child's school and will be allocated by the school towards camps, sports and/or excursion costs for your child.
