# **Principal's Report**

I was very proud of our student leadership group yesterday when they represented our school at the Anzac Day service at War Memorial Park. Our School Captains and Vice Captains were joined by House Captains and Vice Captains, as they honoured our service men and women by laying our wreath. This was a very moving ceremony and it was terrific to see so many school students in attendance with their families to commemorate this very important occasion.

On Wednesday 24th, we held our school Anzac Day ceremony in the hall and Grades Prep - Six respectively listened whilst our student leaders did an exemplary job of explaining the origin of Anzac Day and what it

represented. They read The Prayer of Remembrance and The Ode and laid a wreath at the base of the flag. Parents should be very proud of the mature and respectful manner in which all students participated in the service, listened to The Last Post and observed a minute's silence at the end.



We have had a very smooth start to Term Two and it was great to welcome everyone back and hear about their interesting holiday stories. With two public holidays this week many families took the opportunity to extend their break, therefore we will commence our curriculum programs of Magic Math and Spelling next week. We're looking forward to pre-service teachers from RMIT joining us again this year to run a sequence of Science lessons with our students.

#### **Extracurricular Programs**

We have a diverse range of extracurricular programs at GPS and this term is no exception. We have Coding Extension classes continuing for interested students in Grades 3-6 and an exciting Jellybops Science incursion next Tuesday 30th April. See below for more details:

- **Moove and Groove with Energy Prep 2:** This show explores energy with visually dynamic demonstrations to show transformations of energy, with comic interplay between the characters, The Jolly Professor (Dr Popoff) and his humorous sidekick, Rusty the Robot.
- Natural Phenomena and Energy Grades 3 6: This show delivers a barrage of high energy experiments, looking at air pressure, weather, magnetism and energy transformations including Bio-fuels. Students will learn about the explosive fuel of the future, hydrogen, see many items freeze and shatter under the stress and strain of the super cold liquid nitrogen, watch materials burn, watch air crush an aluminium can, learn more about the properties of solids, liquids.

#### Grade Six Egg Toss Champions

It was lovely to see all the family members who came to watch our Easter Parade and activities on the last day of term. Congratulations to all the students who made a special hat and contributed to the fun and color of the day!

A special highlight of this event is the Annual Grade 6 egg toss where pairs of students throw a raw egg over increasing distances until the egg is broken. Congratulations to Lachlan and Petar who won this year's event with their skillful throwing and deft catching! They even managed to throw further than the staff team of Maria and Erin.

#### NAPLAN

Grade 3 and 5 students will participate in the National Assessment Program – Literacy and Numeracy (NAPLAN) on May 14– May 16. Notes with more detailed information will be sent home to parents of Grade 3 and 5 students next Monday. NAPLAN provides one set of assessment data and contributes to the multiple forms of assessments teachers employ to determine what students have achieved and their areas for improvement and future learning.

If any parents have concerns or queries about their children participating in NAPLAN, please contact your child's teacher or Margaret or myself.

#### **Advance Notice of Pupil Free Days**

Each year, schools are allocated four days they can set aside as 'pupil free' days to allow for professional learning opportunities for staff, curriculum development, etc. The day before students started school, was the first of these four days and two more will be held on Friday 17th May and Monday 4th November - both these days will focus on teacher moderation of student work samples for report writing. Students will not attend school on these days and if numbers permit, OHS Club will provide care for students – please contact them for more information.

Our fourth day has been set aside for a half day Inquiry Learning focus and the remainder of the day focusing on Cultural Understanding and Safety Training, mandated by DET for all staff, which is a key commitment in Marrung: Aboriginal Education Plan. We are currently waiting on confirmation of this date which will be in Term Three.

#### **Attitudes To School Survey**

We value student voice as a means to improving student engagement, wellbeing and quality instruction and are conducting a survey to find out what children in Grades 4 - 6 think of our school. The Attitudes to School Survey is an annual student survey offered by the Department of Education and Training to assist schools in gaining an understanding of students' perceptions and experience of school. Our school will use the survey results to plan programs and activities to improve your child's schooling experience. Further information will be sent home with students in Grades 4 - 6.

#### **Education Week Open Day**

To celebrate Education Week we are holding a Family Activity morning in classrooms on Tuesday 28th May, 9.10 – 11am. The theme of 2019 Education Week is 'Celebrating Careers' and we're encouraging students to think about careers that interest them and come dressed in clothing representative of that workplace. We will commence the day with a parade on the netball court or in the hall, depending on the weather.

# 2019 Premiers' Reading Challenge

Every year at GPS, we strongly encourage and fully support all our students to participate in the Premiers' Reading Challenge. Each and every book that a child reads continues to build their knowledge, wonderment, fluency in reading, vocabulary and comprehension.

Since the challenge began 15 years ago, Victorian children have read more than 45 million books- that is enough to fill nearly 11 Olympic swimming pools. This year children across Victoria will read at least another 4 million books, with more than 150 new titles added to the official book list.

We are excited and optimistic that our students at GPS could read a record number of books during the 2019 challenge. In the coming weeks, letters will be sent home to families that will provide further information regarding the Premier's Reading Challenge and these letters shall contain your child's Premier's Reading Challenge login and password alongside a special bookmark.

Last year, 77 students who completed the challenge were rewarded with a special 'fish and chip' lunch. We are looking forward to seeing even greater participation this year.

What a terrific start to the year we have had in the middle years! It is hard to believe we are already into Term 2 – how time flies!

Both 3/4A and 3/4B have spent the term settling into new routines, designing and discussing classroom expectations as well as being part of building a community that celebrates and encourages personal achievement and success. In this sense we are *teaming for excellence*.



On the 28<sup>th</sup> & 29<sup>th</sup> of March our term's hard work culminated in 2 very special events for the students. Firstly, RACV attended GPS to give a wonderful incursion about bike and road safety. There was a deep message throughout about taking precautions and preventing serious accidents. We were introduced to the importance of wearing a proper fitting helmet to prevent serious brain injury. We also learnt about peripheral vision, reflex and being unable to multitask when focused. It was a fascinating session.

On Friday 29<sup>th</sup> we held a very special 'All about the Brain' morning. Students worked in groups to tackle mind bending illusions, learn hand-to-eye coordination through juggling, train their brains using brain training programs and work together to solve puzzles. Students have also designed brain inspired artwork that has been submitted to the Centre of Excellence for Integrative Brain Function Research at Monash University. This competition was part of Brain Awareness Week (March 11-17) recognizing the need to increase public awareness about brain research globally. Winning students and schools will be announced in May. We had some terrific entries! We thank Simone Wilson and Ryan Purdey for your generous assistance on the morning!

On a personal note we just want to say thank you to the wonderful Greensborough Primary School community for assisting with your children in settling into the middle years. It is a privilege to work with such inspiring, curious and empathetic students. All three of us are proud about what we have seen over Term One and we are so excited to keep up the momentum and team for excellence throughout Term Two and beyond.

# The GATEWAYS Program

G.A.T.E.WAYS was established in 1994 to provide opportunities for highly able and gifted children with special educational needs. Like-minded students can participate in programs that will challenge them intellectually and help develop their individual talents. Both short and longer term programs in all areas of the curriculum are offered in Melbourne schools, 'On Location' and interstate.



G.A.T.E.WAYS is an external provider of educational extension and enrichment activities. Information is sent to the school each term and students are identified with interests in the different programs. G.A.T.E.WAYS provides several programs throughout the year covering a wide range of topics incorporating all areas of the curriculum. A letter is then forwarded for parents to consider if they wish their child to attend. If the child is successful, parents will be notified and once enrolled, G.A.T.E.WAYS deals directly with the parent. A fee is charged for the child to attend. It is your choice whether you would like your child to attend.

The G.A.T.E.WAYS Team Challenge extends children's leadership and problem-solving abilities through a series of original, creative and exciting activities in four areas.

The G.A.T.E.WAYS Challenge is a team based program that:

- Stresses teamwork, not individual prowess
- Provides all participants with an opportunity for leadership
- Is structured to help students learn to work together for a common goal or outcome
- Practises the fundamental skills necessary for competent performance
- Gives satisfaction from the activities themselves as well as the outcome
- Emphasises having fun with learning.
