## Principal's Report

We have had an exciting start to the term with Prep – Grade Six greatly enjoying the Science presentation by 'Jelly Bops' last week. It was terrific to see our students thrilled and engaged with the experiments performed by the Jolly Professor and Rusty the Robot, as well as some audience participants. The experiments explored energy transformations and properties of solids, liquids and gases. The explosive reactions that ensued along with the freezing and shattering of items exposed to liquid nitrogen were highly entertaining as well as thought provoking and aroused great curiosity amongst our young viewers.



We are looking forward to extending our curiosity with the pre-service teachers from RMIT once again visiting our school and running a series of STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering and Mathematics) lessons with students in Grades Prep – Six. These sessions are highly engaging for our students and also provide a great learning opportunity for the pre-service teachers. The program will run for three weeks, beginning next Wednesday 22nd May for Grades Prep – Two and the week after for Grades Three – Six, when they return from Camp.

## Chinese Homestay Student Opportunity

In Term Three, August 5th -8th, our school will be hosting approximately thirty Chinese students for a cultural immersion program. The students will attend our school every day working with a different group of students from grades 3 - 6. The students will take part in half-day enrichment activities in the mornings, including a variety of STEM, Arts, Drama or Sports based learning activities. These sessions will be provided free of charge by Kids Unlimited. In the afternoons, the Chinese students will work in the heritage building with their teachers focusing on English language and Australian culture, and our students will resume their usual class programs.

Kids Unlimited are giving school families the opportunity to provide homestay for some of the students during this time. The Chinese students are looking forward to an Australian family experience. 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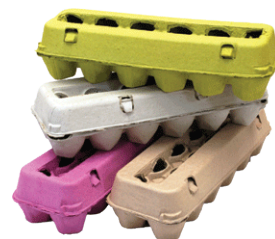
## 2019 Prep Enrolments
