COMPASS

Thank you to School Council President, Kim H. for organising a presentation of COMPASS Online School Management System for us recently. The features of the program are impressive and will modernise and streamline our communication with families and many of our day to day administration tasks, as well as reporting to parents. We have long wanted to implement COMPASS or similar program, however the cost was always a barrier. Fortunately COMPASS was offering a 'deal' for schools who sign up in third term and the cost for one year's licence has been reduced, along with the cost of implementing 'Kiosk' a digital sign-in platform. The cost incurred will be offset by savings made on printing, paper, first aid books, school purchase order books, Skoolbag App, Reporting software Accelerus, as well as human resources. We are very excited about the purchase and have begun the 'behind the scenes' setup. Staff will complete training after school and we anticipate launching the program to parents in 2020.

NAPLAN

NAPLAN results were sent home last Friday and staff have already begun analysing results. Whilst individual student results are important and are addressed by intervention and extension programs, it was highlighted in our recent review, the relative growth of students is the main determinant of how well a school is performing, i.e. a comparison of students' results from Gr 3 to Gr 5, – did students make a low, medium or high growth in that 2 year period? Our results indicated we have made significant high growth and exceeded state percentages for Numeracy, Spelling, Writing, Grammar and Punctuation. Overall our results are very pleasing, and staff are currently analysing our data to determine the curriculum areas across the school that are strengths or areas for improvement for our teaching and learning programs.

WasteWise Wednesday


Every Wednesday at Greensborough Primary School is WasteWise Wednesday!
