Principal's Report

We were extremely pleased with the quality of the applicants for our recently advertised Prep Teacher vacancy and are delighted to announce Darhian Jones was the successful applicant. Darhian came with excellent references and in her interview she impressed the panel not only with her skill set, but also her passion and enthusiasm for joining our community at GPS. Darhian has returned to begin the induction process and meet staff, and is looking forward to the Prep transition sessions, where she will meet her new students for 2020.

In the next newsletter the new Mandarin Language teacher will be announced and with the STEM position currently advertised we are confident we'll have our full staffing profile finalised in the coming weeks.

We are fortunate to have our regular CRTs (casual relief teachers) with the expertise and local knowledge to continue school programs with little or no disruption to students and events, while teachers complete their Professional Practice days this term.

EXTRA-CURRICULAR PROGRAMS:

Relationships Australia

We are pleased to introduce a new program for our Grade 5/6 students to assist them with building healthy relationships and developing essential skills to support them in their transition to secondary school. '*I like, like you*' is an early intervention relationships program that promotes the connection between healthy relationships, and emotional health and wellbeing. With a strong emphasis on mental health promotion, the program introduces students to the knowledge, practical skills and attitudes that promote healthy, equitable and respectful relationships. Grade 5/6s will have 3 weekly sessions of 90 minutes duration and a Parent session will also be offered. A psychologist from the program has met with me to tailor the program to meet our students' needs and we look forward to beginning mid November.

Harold and the Life Education Van

This term the focus of Prep – Six Inquiry units is Health and Safety and earlier this week the Life Education mobile learning centre visited our school to run sessions with our students. Harold's visits are always memorable for our students and the engaging lesson delivery reinforces the Learning Intentions through fun and interactive activities. Students will continue to build on the strategies taught to lead happy and healthy lifestyles by completing the activities in their workbooks. Positive feedback was given from parents who attended the information session after assembly. The cost for this incursion and student workbooks was covered by student subject contributions.

St John Ambulance

St John Ambulance Australia recently held free sessions for our Prep – Grade Six students to promote the importance of first aid in the community and provide to basic first aid training. Teachers were given access to online resources to follow up and reinforce the skills taught.





Walk To School October

Banyule Council were so impressed by the activities Margaret has organised to promote walking to school and the health benefits of exercise that they organised the Leader newspaper to visit our school and photograph our students in action. Our student leaders organise breakfast on the netball court each Friday before school and then Miss T. leads us in a vigorous aerobic session to start the day. Tomorrow we begin our swimming lessons and continue to build healthy habits as we walk to WaterMarc to learn swim and survival techniques and also develop our road safety awareness along the way!



RSL Scholarships

Each year Watsonia RSL supports our school by offering scholarships to two of our Grade Six students. The scholarships are awarded to students who have displayed excellent leadership skills and have been role models for their peers. I am very proud to announce that Violet and Lachlan, our School Captains, are this year's worthy recipients and congratulate them on behalf of our community. Violet and Lachlan will represent our school at a Remembrance Day ceremony at the Watsonia RSL on November 11th. This very moving service will consist of speeches by veterans, followed by our students laying a wreath with other community groups. An award ceremony will then take place followed by light refreshments.

We are continuing to acknowledge students who are displaying our school values by issuing them a raffle ticket. Each Monday morning assembly, a ticket is drawn and a worthy recipient receives a \$20 voucher for Greensborough Plaza. I congratulate Aidan H, Grade 1/2 and Violet S, Gr 6, who were our winners for the last two weeks. Violet is one of our School Captains and is an excellent role model for our students and Aidan consistently displays our school values during both class and recess times.

COMPASS Update

The start-up of COMPASS, our new online management system is going well. Attendance data is now collected online and Visitor and Parent sign-ins are working efficiently, with positive feedback being given by users. Mehgan is currently investigating the process to issue parents an individual login to log their child's absences, etc. We will also begin to use other features of the program and arrange a schedule for full implementation in 2020.
