1/2A & 3/4A:	57% were WasteWise on Wednesday!
3/4B:	63% were WasteWise on Wednesday!
<b>1/2B:</b>	<b>75% were WasteWise on Wednesday!</b>

**Out of 102 students present at G.P.S there were 47 students who had zero waste! This means 46% of the school had Zero Waste! What an incredible achievement!! Well done to all those families!**



WasteWise Wednesday has been a terrific success this year! On behalf of WasteWise Wednesday we thank you for your participation in improving our sustainability here at Greensborough Primary School! We look forward to building on the success of this program in 2020 and beyond! Whilst we will not be collecting data in the coming weeks, you are still welcome to continue being WasteWise!

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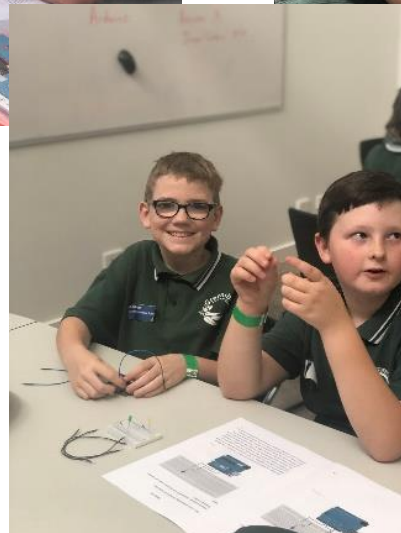
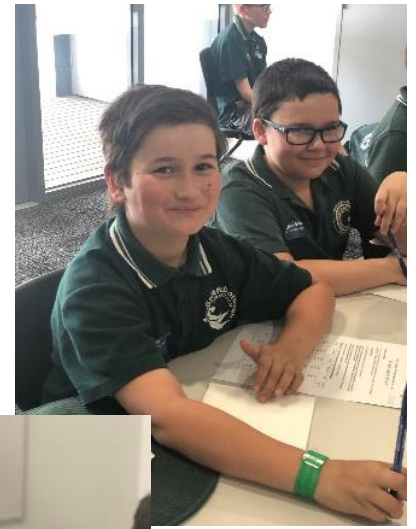
## Grade 5 Secondary School Experience at Greensborough College
