#### **Dental Health Checks**

Banyule Council conducted Dental Health screenings yesterday for Grades 1 – 6 children who had returned their permission notes. They will return to screen the Preps at a later date and conduct education sessions across the school.

Parents and caregivers are reminded that the Banyule Council Dental Health Service is free for all children under 13 years of age and is also open to children who live outside the Banyule area. The service provides dental care, including fillings. Children are given priority for service and the waitlist is currently only a week or two long.

#### **Art Extension**

Each term a different group of students from across the school are offered the opportunity to participate in the Art Extension program. Sometimes the students choose to work on a project to beautify our school grounds, e.g. picket people, school values bollards, and aboriginal totem poles, and other times, they choose to work on mastery of individual skills in the style of a well-known artist, e.g. Picasso. #### **Oz Child School Counselling Services**

Families new to the school may not be aware, that at Greensborough Primary our students are able to access counselling provided by the OzChild organization. This is a great service to families as it means there is very little disruption to the students' day as there is no travel time and parents don't need to take time off work. In order to receive counselling families need to obtain a Mental Health Care Plan and a referral letter from your GP and return them to school and we will forward them to OzChild.

We have been very fortunate to have had excellent health profesionals provided to us and our current counsellor is no exception. If any families would like further information about this service please contact Margaret or myself at any time.

#### **Diamond Valley Community Support Financial Assistance**

Diamond Valley Community support (DVCS) is an independent not-for-profit organisation that provides direct aid, assistance, support and information for people who live in the Banyule City Council area and have an address showing on their Centrelink card in one of the following suburbs: Briar Hill, Bundoora (part of), Eltham North (part of), Greensborough (part of), Lower Plenty, Montmorency, St Helena and Watsonia.

DVCS services currently include a Back to School Program, that provides eligible families a cheque for **\$100** *per child* (up to \$500 per family). The cheque will be made out to the school, and is to be used for educational purposes, i.e. Subject Contributions, camps, excursions, and so on. #### **Family Information Details**

Thank you to all the families who returned the forms with student information details that were sent home last week for families to update. It is important that all families check these details and return them to us with any changes to contact numbers and also medical information to ensure student safety and speedy communication with parents.

Families are also asked to check information re employment details as these may have changed from when you originally filled in the forms. Student funding from the Government is driven by the levels of schooling of students and their family and community characteristics, e.g. types of employment, so it is important we enter the correct data to receive the correct funding entitlement for our students.

# CSEF – Camps, Sports and Excursion Fund

The Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund (CSEF) provides payments for eligible students to attend activities like:

- School camps or trips •
- Swimming and school-organised sport programs •
- Outdoor education programs •
- Excursions and incursions.



Families holding a valid means-tested concession card or temporary foster parents are eligible to apply and can list more than one student in the one application form if they are attending the same school. A Special Consideration category also exists. See Mehgan for an application form.

Payments amounts for 2020 are:

\$125 per year for eligible primary school students

# STEM Program



We have had another exciting fortnight in our Science room, with plenty more experiments happening across all year levels. Throughout these sessions we have been learning what it means to make predictions and observations.

In Prep we explored what would make ice melt faster, dirt, sand, water or salt. In Grades 1 & 2 we observed coloured water being sucked up the stem of a flower, and changing the colour of its petals. In Grades 3 to 6 we looked at how fire burns oxygen and when there is no oxygen left, it creates a vacuum resulting in suction.

We are once again looking forward to more hands-on exploring next week!

# Library Bags

## The proven benefits of reading with your child *Primary English Teaching Association Australia*

'Parents and carers who read aloud with children in a secure, safe and comfortable context motivate their children to read.

Parents' perceptions, values, attitudes, and expectations play an important role in influencing their children's attitudes toward reading, and subsequent literacy development. When children share a book with someone who makes them feel special, the attitude that reading is pleasurable is transferred to other reading encounters.'

We are all busy people but if you can find time to share a book with your child for 10 minutes a day, research suggests that relationships are strengthened, children's reading and self-esteem improves and children read more. Sharing stories unites families.

I thought I would include this poem by the one and only Julia Donaldson, who is a British poet, playwright, writer, songwriter, performer and author of 'The Gruffalo' and many more wonderful picture books.

#### I Opened a Book Julia Donaldson (2014)

I opened a book and in I strode Now nobody can find me. I've left my chair, my house, my road, My town and my world behind me.

# From the Art room...

It's great to be back at GPS after long service leave and I look forward to seeing some wonderful creativity from all our students in the Art room! This year, I am working at GPS on Wednesdays and each grade will have an Art session every fortnight. We will also be continuing our popular Art Extension Program to complete special projects that extend our skills and enrich the school environment. Our first Art Extension project was to finish off an art installation and planting project in the courtyard outside the Principal's office.

## **VISUAL DIARIES**

The majority of student work in Art is completed in a visual diary, which is retained in the Art room. This book lasts for around 2 to 3 years and is an excellent way of acknowledging and keeping a record of each student's work. Once their first visual diary is full, the student can bring it home and will be provided with another one. If you would like to see more of what your child is achieving in Art, you are most welcome to come to the Art room and view their Visual Diary. They are located in labelled tubs on the bench just inside the Art room door.

## SMOCKS

The Art room now provides smocks for students, so there is no need to purchase a smock. This means that every student has access to an appropriate long-sleeved waterproof smock for occasions when we are working with paint, clay or other messy media.

## ART FOCUS FOR TERM 1

This term's skill focus is Painting & Drawing. Exploring the topic of "Cats – Wild & Tame" Grades 1 to 6 will be learning to observe shapes, draw detail, add texture and explore blending and shading techniques. Later this term, Preps will be introduced to the Art room and become familiar with the materials and equipment that we use.

If your children would like to do some extra Art at home, I recently discovered this website: "I Am An Artist". It is a visual arts initiative aimed at supporting primary teachers and pupils in the adoption and delivery of the visual arts curriculum in Ireland. 
