### CSEF

Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund applications

The Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund helps eligible families to cover the costs of school trips, camps and sporting activities.



CAMPS, SPORTS AND EXCURSIONS FUND (CSEF)

If you have a valid means-tested concession card, such as a Veterans Affairs Gold Card, Centrelink Health Care Card or Pensioner Concession Card, or are a temporary foster parent, you may be eligible. There is also a special consideration category for asylum seeker and refugee families.

Payment amounts this year are \$125 for eligible primary school students. Payments are made direct to the school to use towards expenses relating to camps, excursions and sporting activities for the benefit of your child.

If you applied for CSEF through our school last year, you do not need to complete an application form this year, unless there has been a change in your family circumstances.

If you would like to apply for the first time, please contact the school office on 03 9435 1496 and ask for an application form.

Ingredients: 1 packet of frozen puff pastry (6 sheets) 1 jar tomato paste/salsa 1 packet of shredded cheese Baking paper Oven trays Thaw pastry 15 mins prior to making. Preheat oven to 170 degrees. Spread tomato paste/salsa over the pastry Add shredded cheese making sure you take the ingredients to within 1cm from the pastry edge. Roll pastry (not too tight) from one side to the other. Cut into bite size pieces (approximately 3.5cms) and place on tray lined with baking paper. Put in oven and bake until golden brown. Delicious hot or cold. Other ingredients that you can substitute are: Vegemite instead of tomato paste/salsa Jam or Nutella on their own. .
