#### **Principal's Report**

It's hard to believe we have only one week until the end of Term One. It has been a very busy and productive term with the establishment of a Wellbeing Worker, new tutoring programs in Literacy and Numeracy, as well as our usual extension, intervention, core curriculum program and extra curricula activities. This time last year we were preparing for the possibility of Remote and Flexible Learning and the uncertainty of what lay ahead. We have come a long way, and one year on, we are enjoying the easing of restrictions and enthusiastically preparing for Term Two with the Winter Season of Inter School Sport, Wellbeing programs, excursions planned to complement class Discovery programs and Clubs (with Preps included!) to name just a few of the special activities that will be taking place. We are absolutely committed to achieving the goals in our Annual Improvement Plan for our priorities of Happy Healthy Kids, Learning Achievement- both catchup and extension, and Building Connections to school.

I'd like to thank our committed staff who have worked tirelessly to achieve the best outcomes for our students, Parents and Friends who continue to raise funds for school resources, our volunteers who generously give their time and our families who support our school in so many ways. Your children are the beneficiaries of everyone's collective efforts.

#### **Wellbeing Programs**

Robyn has been with us for only a fortnight, however she has already got to know many of the children and become a familiar presence in classrooms. Robyn has started a Breakfast Club on Wednesday mornings, lunchtime program on Mondays and contacted agencies who may be able to provide additional support for families. Robyn also has begun the Seasons for Growth program which offers children and young people a safe space to come together, and share their experiences of change and loss.

Beginning next Monday from 2:30 – 3pm, Robyn is going to run Cuppa Club for parents/carers to enjoy a cup of tea or coffee before assembly is held at 3pm. This will be served from the canteen and all family members are welcome.



#### **Easter Festivities**



Next Thursday 1st April, we'll have our much anticipated Easter activities. Commencing at 9:10am we'll have the Easter Hat parade which will be followed by class Easter races and the famous Grade 6 'Egg Toss'. We'll finish the festivities with a whole school Easter Egg Hunt. Events such as these make long lasting and powerful memories that stay with children for much of their lives. Everyone in the community is welcome to come along and share the joy of the morning.

#### **Road Safety and Street Parking**

Student safety is extremely important to us at Greensborough Primary and I have been advised that several cars are illegally parking across the school crossing in Lorimer Street. This practice reduces drivers' capacity to see our students wanting to cross the road and also students' capacity to see cars approaching. I urge all school families to park safely, keep our students safe and avoid incurring a fine from Banyule Council Parking Officers.

#### **Buildings and Grounds**

We were pleased to hear this week that our application for a \$5000 maintenance grant from DET to demolish the existing spoon drain outside the Grade 5/6 classroom, remove debris and replace the spoon drain was successful. The grant doesn't cover the total costs however we will cover the remainder from our maintenance budget. Replacement of this drain has been on our 'bucket list' for some time and we are happy that rainwater will no longer form large puddles near the classroom door.

We have also planned to replace the air conditioning unit that services the Grade 3/4 area and Curiosity Corner. This is part of our rollout to replace one of our aging evaporative units each year. Both tasks will be completed in the school holidays so the teaching and learning programs of the students will be unaffected.

#### Cosy Coop - Chicken Update

We are looking forward to chickens returning to Cosy Coop in Term Two! At the end of last year, the large tree that provided shade for the chicken coop had to be felled and we made a decision not to replace the chickens over the hot summer. Early this term Wayne and Geoff placed a sun shade sail over the top of the coop in preparation for the chickens return. One of our families has offered to donate some pullets for us, so when they're of a suitable age, we'll settle them into Cosy Coop. Our Grade 3/4 monitors greatly enjoy taking care of both our chickens and our rabbits and we appreciate the benefits of having our animals at school.



This is our last newsletter of the term. Any information to be sent home next week will be sent via COMPASS. I am currently on Long service Leave for the last 3 days of this week and Margaret is Acting Principal in my absence. Students will be dismissed at 1:30 on the last day of term, Thursday 1st April, after an assembly at 1:15pm.

#### **CSEF**

Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund applications

The Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund helps eligible families to cover the costs of school trips, camps and sporting activities.



If you have a valid means-tested concession card, such as a Veterans Affairs Gold Card, Centrelink Health Care Card or Pensioner Concession Card, or are a temporary foster parent, you may be eligible. There is also a special consideration category for asylum seeker and refugee families.

Payment amounts this year are \$125 for eligible primary school students. Payments are made direct to the school to use towards expenses relating to camps, excursions and sporting activities for the benefit of your child.

If you applied for CSEF through our school last year, you do not need to complete an application form this year, unless there has been a change in your family circumstances.

If you would like to apply for the first time, please contact the school office on 03 9435 1496 and ask for an application form.

#### **Library News**

#### The State Library of Victoria is so worth a visit and it's free!

The Pauline Gandel Children's Quarter, supported by Gandel Philanthropy, is a free, purpose-built space for children aged up to 12 years (and their parents and carers) to read, learn and play, with an associated program of activities. The space spans two floors and features a two-storey children's castle: the top floor is designed for kids aged 8 to 12 years, and the lower level caters for younger children.

You'll also find reading nooks, a play space and a <u>browsing collection of more than 4000 children's books</u>, including Braille books and books in languages other than English. Zoned areas have been designed to cater for children as they grow and develop, with specific areas and activities targeted towards babies, toddlers, pre-schoolers, primary schoolers and pre-teens.

To cater for your family's comfort, you are permitted to bring food and drink for babies and toddlers into this area. There's also a private family room with breastfeeding and baby change facilities, toilets for both children and adults, and space to park prams.

#### State Library of Victoria - Free event

During the school holidays there is a special presentation and workshop with award-winning author and artist, **Gabrielle Wang!** Gabrielle combines her love of adventure and the supernatural with her Chinese heritage to craft spellbinding tales and illustrations. She is the author of the highly acclaimed books 'Ting Ting the ghosthunter' and 'A ghost in my suitcase books'.



Both events will include a creative illustration workshop:

- 7 April 2021 at 11 11:45am: Workshop for children 5 7 years, Conversation Quarter Gabrielle takes children on a storytelling race for the Chinese zodiac.
- **7 April 2021** at **1 2pm**: Workshop for children 8 12 years, Conversation Quarter Gabrielle shares the magic of her books, what life as an author is like and what sparked her love of ghosts.

Last week in STEM we wrapped up our investigation into the Solar System and Space after the students become very excited and interested in the Mars Rover landing. 


