### **Principal's Report**

We were very pleased to welcome our students back onsite last Friday after two weeks of Remote Learning and they are to be congratulated on how well they settled back into their class and school programs. Thank you to parents and carers for assisting your children with their Home Learning Program. We've said it before, but I think it bears repeating, that we appreciate that it's challenging for many families to assist your children to log on to digital platforms and complete their Remote Learning lessons and also complete your own tasks, whether you're working from home or trying to complete your normal daily responsibilities. The mental health and wellbeing of families is a priority for us, as well as improving student learning outcomes, and this is also mandated by DET for 2021. It's a credit to families and your children's resilience that most returned to school ready to pick up where they left off.

When planning for a possible/probable return to Remote Learning, we used our experience from our lockdown earlier this year, that the government preference seemed to be for shorter circuit-breaker periods if possible, rather than a return to long term Remote Learning. We referred to important feedback from families in 2020, regarding the challenges and stress for parents and carers of working from home, caring for younger siblings or other family members, whilst trying to assist with their children's Home Learning tasks, including logging on to watch instructional videos online or attend meetings. This feedback was factored into the tasks for Weeks One and Two of our Home Learning Plan, allowing families to reacquaint themselves with establishing routines and using digital platforms. If the lockdown had continued for longer than two weeks, we had plans in place to scaffold the inclusion of more online teaching groups and meetings for students, whilst still monitoring families' wellbeing and engagement levels, and offering support where necessary. Pleasingly, feedback from families when contacted during Remote Learning over the last two weeks was positive, with the majority of families indicating they were coping with the Home Learning regime. If any Parents and Carers have further feedback, apart from that given to class teachers, please email myself or Margaret.

We're looking forward to welcoming our family members and volunteers back on site in Term Three, if allowed. Guidelines may change over the weekend, however rather than 'chop and change' for the last week of term, we are keeping current practices in place, so we have consistent routines for our community for the

last week. In anticipation that restrictions will ease for Term Three and parents, carers and volunteers will be onsite, whether for outdoor assemblies or at drop and pickup times, we have a QR code that we will display near entry gates. As part of our COVID safe plan, parents and carers will be required to sign in with the QR code when you enter the school grounds. Any family members, volunteers or contractors who are inside the building for 15 minutes or more will also be required to sign in at the office with our COMPASS system as part of our Emergency Management procedures. We thank everyone in advance for adhering to our COVIDsafe protocols.

On a different note, we've had some wild and wintry weather over the last week. I sincerely hope that our GPS community or your extended families weren't adversely affected by last Wednesday night's storm. We had some damage at school to our water tank outside the Grade 1/2 classrooms, however this has since been repaired. Fortunately, we are able to have contractors onsite for essential work, especially OH&S safety maintenance. Over the term holidays we plan to have the spoon drain outside the Grade 5/6 classrooms replaced so that water will flow into the drain, rather than collect in a large puddle.

We also have a willing band of helpers who are knitting and crocheting a new 'sleeve' for our Friendship Tree and the tree on the corner of the circuit. When the sleeves were created last year, they greatly enhanced the trees and drew a great deal of positive feedback from the wider community. Exposure to the weather has taken its toll and the sleeves are now needing to be restored to their former glory. We thank our volunteers for donating their time and expertise to this project to enhance our school grounds. #### Assessment, Reporting and Parent/Teacher Interviews

Thank you to the staff for their diligence and hard work in evaluating student results and writing reports. Staff spend many hours on this process and whilst it is a normal part of their role as teachers, they have demonstrated their deep knowledge of the students they teach and reported accurately to parents so that our students' social and academic progress can be celebrated. Areas for improvement and future learning were also identified and these will be the focus for future learning in Semester Two.

Reports for students will be sent to parents and carers via COMPASS tomorrow afternoon, Friday 18th June at 4pm. Under current DET operational guidelines, we are unable to have face to face Parent/Teacher interviews this term to discuss your child's progress. We are therefore rescheduling P/T interviews on the second Tuesday in Term 3, Tuesday 20th July. Bookings for interview times will once again be via our COMPASS platform and will go live next Monday 21st June at 5pm. If any families need assistance with your logon details for COMPASS, please contact the office. If any parents/carers require a hard copy of your child's report to be sent home, please contact your child's class teacher.



We have a very caring and inclusive culture at GPS, and this was highlighted recently when one of our Grade 3/4 students, Tyler, noticed that two of our Prep students, Alex and Mary, were having difficulty mastering a new game. Tyler patiently explained how to play the game and stayed to coach and encourage their efforts. Well done, Tyler!

As I informed families via COMPASS at the beginning of the week, I am currently on Long Service Leave, returning next Tuesday 21st June. I am very appreciative that NSW opened its border to Victoria in time for me to attend my granddaughter's birthday. In the meantime, it's business as usual at school, with Margaret taking the role of Acting Principal in my absence. This newsletter was finalised Tuesday 15th June, so if any of there are any updates, Margaret will send information home via COMPASS.

After a successful virtual event last year, they're back in 2021 to continue to inspire girls.

Go Girl, Go for IT challenges that view and aims to excite and engage female school students by introducing them to this world.

It opens up the possibilities of following careers in everything from analysis to user design to development to data science (just to name a few!). #### Get Active Kids-Free voucher up to \$200

Do your children love sport and getting active? Does your family have a Health Care Card or Pensioner Concession Card? You may be eligible for up to \$200 to support your child's sport and active recreation activities. Find out more at www.getactive.vic.gov.au/vouchers

Round 2 of the Get Active Kids Voucher Program is now open and closes on 9 July! The \$21 million Get Active Kids Voucher Program is a Victorian first and supports children to get involved in organised sport and physical activities by providing vouchers valued up to \$200 each, to help eligible families with the cost of memberships or registration fees, equipment or uniforms. The Program will support 100,000 vouchers and help Victorian children to get back on the pitch, court, the nets, field or in the pool – to have fun with their friends. The Program is part of Get Active Victoria, which is helping families to move more, every day.

#### \$250 Power Saving Bonus

The \$250 Power Saving Bonus for Pensioner Concession recipients and some Health Care Card holders (including JobSeeker, Youth Allowance, Austudy and Abstudy recipients) is now available. Before submitting an application for the bonus, please read the eligibility requirements.

**Eligibility Requirements:** 

- You must be a Victorian residential energy consumer (i.e. have a residential electricity account).
- You must be receiving payments under one of the following concession programs:
  - **Centrelink Pensioner Concession**
  - JobSeeker, Youth Allowance, Austudy or Abstudy •
  - Department of Veterans Affairs Pensioner Concession
  - Or hold a Department of Veterans Affairs Gold Card
- Pension Concession Card holders who are not receiving payments, and Health Care Cards holders who are not receiving Youth Allowance, JobSeeker, Austudy or Abstudy payments, are not eligible.

#### **Newsfeed Sort Function**

Parent/carer users can now sort their newsfeed by 'most important' or 'most recent.' The default view will place important school posts first, but users can now toggle the feed view to ensure they don't miss a post.

#### **Important News**

NewsFeed posts that are marked as a priority by the school will be highlighted with an 'important news' banner so they can't be missed by parents/carers.

#### Save Posts

To make posts easy to find we've added a handy bookmark. Parent/carer users can now bookmark any Newsfeed posts they want to keep for reference, such as upcoming event information that they may need after they have consented. When they no longer need the post, they can simply 'unsave'.
