### **Principal's Report**

At last, the 'light at the end of the tunnel' is definitely in view! We are very pleased that our students will be returning onsite in the coming weeks and our classrooms and playgrounds will once again resonate with the sounds of our students working and playing together. We're confident that the majority of students will settle quickly back into school routines, however we will continue to work closely with families if any students require additional support. Our priorities of student wellbeing, engagement and learning remain our priorities for Term 4, and we'll be supporting students who need to 'catch up', as well as continuing to extend the learning of students who have made expected gains.

The 'Roadmap', which is based on advice from the Victorian Chief Health Officer, sets out the staged return to onsite learning in Term 4, with the plan being that all students return onsite by Friday 5 November. For our school, this means that the arrangements below will be in place. Remote and flexible learning will be delivered to students on the days they are not onsite.

We are having the fourth and final raffle this Friday, so please bring along your gold coins for this fundraising effort.



### **Curriculum Programs**

We were very excited this week when one of our ex-students, Daniel Mason, met with our Grade 3 - 6 students online to discuss his journey to become Australia's Barefoot Ninja Champion. Later in this newsletter, Jesse Stephens has shared the highlights of this event and we thank him for organising this great opportunity for our students to talk about setting and achieving goals.

The Life Education Van and Harold have been rescheduled to 2022 as we are unable to have incursions this Term. Fortunately, Life Ed has made digital resources available to teachers and we're looking forward to welcoming Harold back to GPS early in 2022.

Book Week is a highlight of our school year and Jen Farley has once again rescheduled activities to ensure we're able to enjoy this event together. The Book Fair, Multi-Age Day and Parade will be held in Week 8, commencing Monday 22<sup>nd</sup> November 2021.

### Victorian High-Ability Program

Congratulations to Aiden L, and Sienna W for their successful completion of the Victorian High-Ability Program for Term 3. This was their second time participating in the program, completing the Primary English course over 10 weeks virtually. At GPS, we are so proud of their achievement and commitment to the program throughout Remote Learning. They will each receive a certificate in their next learning pack. Well done!

For Term 4, we are proud to announce that Alysha will be taking part in the Primary Mathematics course which started this week. We wish Alysha all the best with the program and we're looking forward to hearing all about it.

### **Return To School Protocols**

At our current stage in the Government roadmap, we remain unable to have parents or volunteers onsite when students return, so we ask parents to "kiss and drop" at the gates and staff members will assist younger students to go to their classrooms if required. Parents are also asked to avoid congregating at the gates during drop-off and pickup times. Staff will wait with students for parents to collect them after school. We will have 3 gates open: 1 in Horonda St, Lorimer St (near the cricket nets) and on the top corner near the Heritage Building – please make sure your child knows the gate you will collect them from.

Students will continue to use hand sanitiser when entering classrooms and in line with advice regarding ventilation, doors and windows will remain open as much as possible. We ask parents to ensure that students have clothing suitable for the weather, given that rooms will be open for increased airflow.

At this stage external allied health professionals are not allowed onsite, however if the guidelines change, we will advise families and, as we have done in the past, and we'll provide a dedicated space for Occupational Therapists, Speech Pathologists and Psychologists to work with the students they see.

### 2022 Grade Planning

While we're in the midst of planning for students' return this term, the planning for 2022 continues. In the next few weeks, teachers will ask students to nominate friendship groups so we can begin the process of allocating students to their 2022 grades. We understand this may seem strange for families, when students have not been with their friends on-site, however this is a very lengthy process, and we need this information to assist us with our planning. The process also includes teachers' consideration of students' friendship groups, school data on academic abilities and needs, and parent input on specific requests for their children.

We will be finalising grades by the end of October, so we can begin handover of student information from this year's teacher to next. Therefore, if parents or caregivers have any specific requests for next year it's very important that you send in your requests via email, phone, handwritten note or in person, to the office, Margaret or myself **by Friday October 22**<sup>nd</sup> and this can be factored into decision making. Based on current information, next year's classroom teachers will be the same as 2021.

Notification of 2022 grades will be sent home with reports on Friday December 10<sup>th</sup> and students will meet their 2022 teachers and spend the morning with them on Tuesday 14<sup>th</sup> December.

We are making every effort to ensure successful transitions for children moving from kindergarten into Prep and the Grade 6s moving into Year 7. We're planning for Prep transition sessions and Graduation and more information will be sent to families when we receive updated advice from DET.

### **Curriculum Day: Monday 1st November**

When students return, teachers will be working closely to re-engage them and also completing Literacy and Numeracy assessments to determine their current achievement levels and using the information to drive their planning and determine students' needs for the rest of the year. Teachers have been gathering assessment data as best they can whilst we've been in Remote Learning, however when students return teachers will need to gather further reliable assessment data, analyse it, and write reports. This year, more than any other, the Curriculum Day on the Monday before Cup Day is essential for teachers to come together to moderate students' work samples, analyse students' assessment tasks and begin to write Semester Two reports.

We have not received any advice from DET as to whether this year's reports will be in a modified format due to Remote and Flexible Learning. If there are changes to our usual report structure, we will inform parents. Teachers will make judgements on student achievement based on the work and assessments completed during Remote Learning and also assessments conducted in the coming weeks when students are back on-site.

### SunSmart

A reminder that when students return on-site in the coming weeks, they'll be required to wear their hats for outdoor activities, this includes recess, lunch and Physical Education lessons. (*From September*  $1^{st}$  – *April*  $30^{th}$  *is when the average UV alert is 3 and above.*) Please check your children's school bags or wardrobes for hats. (School hats are available at the office for \$11.00.)

I sincerely hope families were able to have some much-deserved rest and relaxation over the break after your tremendous efforts to support Home Learning last Term. We were pleased that the flowers given to families and the Holiday Surprise bags for students in recognition and appreciation of your efforts, brought some joy on the last day of term.



We're looking forward to having a terrific fourth Term and celebrating our students' achievements together as soon as the roadmap allows.

### 2022 PARENT PAYMENT PLAN

Dear Parents,

On Friday details will be sent out via COMPASS of the 2022 Parent Payment Plan which has been drawn up under the guidelines of the Department's new Parent Payment Policy.

The information that will be sent home is pretty self-explanatory but the main changes from the Greensborough Primary perspective are:

- The school can no longer order student resources on behalf of parents, but parents are able to order student learning packs directly from the supplier for delivery to school. There will be details of this process in the information pack.
- Families paid \$48 as part of the 2021 Subject contributions for the cost of the Footstep Dance incursions and bus costs for the concert. As this has not been able to proceed, for Grades Prep 5 these funds will be rolled over to cover Footsteps next year and for 2021 Grade 6 students this will cover the cost of Graduation (*any Grade 6 families who have not yet paid the 2021 Subject Contributions will need to pay the Graduation costs*)
- Families paid \$16.50 as part of the 2021 Subject Contributions for the Life Education program. As this has not been able to proceed, for Grades Prep 5 these funds will be rolled over to cover Life Education next year and for 2021 Grade 6 students this will cover the cost of Graduation Bears (*any Grade 6 families who have not yet paid the 2021 Subject Contributions will need to pay the Graduation Bear costs if they would like to purchase one*)

The booklist items purchase from Rapid Office Supplies do not include the individual student Spelling Mastery books however, due to some investigation on Mr Stephen's part we have been able to access these books for 2022 at a reduced price and the school will have these ready for 2022. If we are unable to do this again next year the books may be another additional item to be included on lists.

It is unfortunate that, at a time when there is already so much change happening around us, that we have had to implement these changed protocols right now, but we have done the best we can to make the process streamlined and easy to understand.

After you receive the information packs on Friday, please do not hesitate to contact the school if you have any queries or require further clarification.

This program focuses on tasks that stimulate students' critical thinking, problem solving and creativity – enriching their understanding of English and Mathematics. Students will be pushed out of their learning comfort zone. This program selects students based on their academic results and only a small percentage from the state are included each term.

Sienna W and Aiden completed the 10 week virtual Primary English program in Term 3. They continued their commitment through remote learning and worked hard to complete the program. Congratulations to Sienna W and Aiden for doing a great job with the program.

Congratulations to Alysha who has been chosen to take part in the Term 4 Primary Mathematics program: Patterns (From Symbols to Secrets). This course will encourage students to discover that mathematics is not about 'getting to the answer', by demonstrating there are often multiple solutions and multiple strategies. Students will explore concepts that are not usually covered in the primary mathematics curriculum, such as number patterns, alternative numeral systems and cryptography. They will be pushed to view mathematics as a process of exploration, and encouraged to ask questions, make conjectures, and test ideas.

I am looking forward to welcoming ALL our students back over the next month. I will have more to say about preparing our students for their return in the next newsletter.

### Recipe
