The Book Fair will be in the Library and entry will be via the external door. Thank you to Jen for organising our Special Activities day on Wednesday, based on the short-listed books from the Australian Book Council.

#### **Junior School Council**

Now that we're back onsite, our JSC members are working hard to raise funds for school projects. Friday icy-pole sales are booming, and we thank families for supporting JSC fund-raising efforts. I congratulate them on the \$133 they raised last week and look forward to them utilising their Student Voice to decide what projects they'll support.

#### Student Leaders 2022

We are now well into the process of appointing our student leadership team for 2022. Last week our Grade Four and Five students were invited to nominate for our 2022 Student Wellbeing Leadership positions. At next Monday's assembly we will congratulate our successful candidates and present them with a certificate to acknowledge their new roles. Lynette Taylor, one of our Educational Support staff coordinates the Student Wellbeing leaders Program and she has met with our new leaders to begin training for their new positions. Over the next few weeks we'll work together to develop students' skills in: Active Listening, Asking Open-Ended Questions, Referring on to Teachers and Protocols at the Friendship Tree, in readiness for next year.

On Monday 29<sup>th</sup> November students will give their speeches for School Captain and in the week beginning 6<sup>th</sup> December, students will give speeches to respective House members for House Captain and Vice-Captain positions. Our students put a great deal of thought into their speeches as they reflect on how they will make a positive contribution to our school and I wish them all the best as they strive for leadership positions.

### **Prep Transition**

Each Friday morning in November we host transition sessions for our 2022 Prep students and we're enjoying the opportunity to get to know each student and begin to build relationships with our new families. Darhian has made contact with kindergartens our students are currently at and has begun to visit the kinders and complete the handover of information to ensure a successful transition from kindergarten to school for our 2022 Preps. Our current Prep students are enjoying working hard with Mrs Mac to continue their learning program whilst Darhian engages with our new students.

### **Buildings and Grounds**

To encourage the use of outdoor learning spaces, grants of \$25,000 were available to schools to erect shade sails. We applied for a shade sail over the amphitheatre and were advised recently that we were successful. We're in the process of collecting quotes and we hope to have the installation completed as soon as possible. The sail will not only provide shade so classes can use the amphitheatre for outdoor lessons but will provide great sun protection during school assemblies.

Thank you to Wayne and Geoff for donating their time and expertise to complete essential maintenance tasks around the school and also improve our facilities. The seating they've built outside the Grade 5/6 classrooms is another valuable outdoor space for our senior classes to use. Les has also been diligently working in our garden beds and tidying our school grounds and we're grateful for his continued support of our school.

If any parents would like to donate some time to assist with weeding or laying mulch on garden beds near the amphitheatre, please contact the office.

The restumping of the heritage building is well underway and I thank families for using the other gates for entry and exits. Funding for the restumping is provided through our Planned Maintenance Grant, which will also be used for roofing repairs and resurfacing of the netball court.

### Save The Date: End Of Year Twilight Picnic!

We're all looking forward to our end of year picnic on Monday 13<sup>th</sup> December. This family evening is one of the highlights of our school year and we're grateful that we are able to hold this outdoor event and celebrate together as a community. Teachers have organised activities for the evening and each grade will sing a Christmas Carol at the picnic. Families are encouraged to bring a picnic dinner and we sincerely hope everyone can join us.

## COVID Operational Guidelines Update – Vaccination requirements for parents and carers attending schools

As stated in the weekend's COMPASS post, DET has updated our Operation Guidelines and parents are required to be vaccinated or have an exemption in order to enter school buildings or attend **indoor** school events. (Full details below).

Under the current guidelines, *parents do not have to be vaccinated to be outdoors onsite* and are able to enter the school grounds at drop off and pick up times. Our Christmas Picnic is an outdoor event, and, if the weather permits, our annual Book Week Dress-up Parade will also be held outdoors and all parents/carers may attend if they observe COVID-safe protocols, including social distancing.

Parents/Carers attending Student Support Groups meetings (SSGs) will have the option of an outdoor or online meeting, if they are unable to attend an indoor meeting.

Prep Transition will proceed with outdoor tea/coffee setup and parents will have the option to drop off and collect our 2022 Preps from the usual classroom door near the Friendship Tree.

### DET Vaccination requirements for parents and carers attending schools:

All parents and carers attending schools, including for drop off and pick up must adhere to physical distancing, density limits, face mask requirements and practise respiratory etiquette and good hand hygiene.

Parents and carers who enter school buildings must check in using the QR code.

Parents and carers who enter school buildings must also have had at least one dose of COVID-19 vaccine and must have had two doses of COVID-19 vaccine by 29 November 2021 or have a valid medical exception with the following limited exceptions:

- When attending to administer medical treatment to their own child when the treatment cannot be administered by the school
- When attending to collect their child who is unwell and cannot leave the school building unaccompanied by their parent/carer.
- When attending for a momentary period that does not involve any sustained contact with staff or students, for example, to collect a completed art project or similar.

Parents and carers attending any event or activity inside a school building including, but not limited to tours, graduations, kindergarten transition, whole of school events are required to show evidence of vaccination.

Meetings and other discussions (such as Student Support Group meetings) with parents and carers who do not meet vaccination requirements should be held virtually.

Parents and carers attending school sites for drop off and pick up who do not enter school buildings do not need to comply with vaccination requirements.

If any parents or carers have any queries about our COVID safe protocols, please don't hesitate to contact us.

### **Active Kids: Support For Families**

Does your child love sport and being active? Does your family have a Health Care Card or Pensioner Concession Card? You may be eligible for up to \$200 to put towards the cost of your child's participation in physical activities. As children return to sport over the coming months, the Get Active Kids Voucher Program helps eligible families get their kids involved in organised sport and active recreation activities.

Under the program, children may be eligible to **receive up to \$200** to help with the cost of membership and registration fees, uniforms, and equipment. The program also provides a special consideration stream to support children residing in care services as well as temporary or provisional visa holders, undocumented migrants or international students.



Applications for vouchers in round three of the program close at 5pm Tuesday 30 November. For eligibility requirements and to apply, visit the Get Active Victoria website.

### Book Week 2021

Next week we are able to run our annual Greensborough **Book Week**. This is exciting news and I look forward to seeing some of you at the Book Fair and/or Book Parade.

Our school **Book Fair** will be delivered on Tuesday, November 23<sup>rd</sup>. This year, parents and other family members will be able to attend under the latest guidelines. '*Parents and carers who enter school buildings must also have had at least one dose of COVID-19 vaccine or have a valid medical exception.*' Masks must also be worn.

If you would like to attend the Book Fair, parents and guardians will be entering and exiting via the **outside door.** 

The students will all visit the Book Fair during the day of Tuesday 23<sup>rd</sup> and complete a **'Wish List'**, which is a list of items that your child likes. There is no compulsion to buy any of the items on the list, but if you would like to, then there are three alternatives for payment.

- You can go online and purchase items that your child would like. Once you place your order a receipt number will be generated which you will record and return to school with the Wish List. The web address is <u>www.scholastic.com.au/payment</u>. Be sure to choose **Book Fairs** payments, not Book Club.
- 2. You can also send **cash** with your child for the amount on their Wish List or to purchase as they wish from the Book Fair.
- 3. Or can attend the Book Fair in person and pay via card or with cash.

The Book Fair is an exciting time for our students and in the past it has been lovely to see so many of our families attend and support our library. The school benefits financially from the Book Fair as we receive a percentage of sales. All money raised is used towards library purchases.

If you want more information about the Book Fair please feel free to contact me at school. I am very happy to help children with selection of books and if you would like a purchase to put away for Christmas that can be organised. Some families often purchase a book/s for a donation towards our library.

# **History Box Incursion**







#### Recipe

#### **Rice Paper Wraps**

#### Ingredients

- -50g rice vermicelli noodles
- -1 carrot, peeled
- -1 avocado, peeled and destoned
- -1/4 cucumber
- -8 rice paper wraps
- -8 mint leaves
- -Sweet chilli sauce, to serve

-Put the noodles in a pan of water and bring to the boil, simmer for 3 min, then cool under running water. Drain thoroughly.

-Cut the carrot into matchsticks. Cut the avocado into strips and the cucumber into strips. Soak 2 of he rice paper wraps In cold water for 1-2 mins until floppy.

-Lift 1 sheet of rice paper out of the water then lay it carefully on a board. Placed the veggies in the centre and fold into a roll. Repeat with the rest of the rice paper.

-Serve the rolls with the sweet chilli sauce for dipping.
