It was a terrific day for our Librarian Jen Farley, as this was the last Book Week she'll organise for us at GPS... we'll ensure we hold the baton high and keep the tradition strong in 2022 and beyond! Congratulations to the students who won the class prize for their costumes.





Over \$3200 was spent at the Book Fair and Jen will use the 20% commission to purchase further resources for our Library. It was lovely to see parents and students together onsite investigating the treasures on sale and purchasing items from students' wish lists. The Activity Day was also a great success with children rotating between art and craft activities based on the Australian Book Council's 2021 short-listed books.



Next Monday at 9:00am we will hold our usual assembly with our weekly agenda items and at 3:00pm we will have an extraordinary assembly where we celebrate Jen's expansive teaching career and impending retirement. If the weather is fine, we'll hold our assembly on our magnificent new netball court and we invite parents and past students to attend. #### **Students Reports and 2022 Grades**

A very big thank you to staff who have worked diligently over the last month to write student reports that accurately reflect students' achievements and their areas for future learning. As per 2020, DET has mandated that Semester Two reports are to be modified and focus on student progress in Literacy and Numeracy.

During Remote Learning our Home Learning Programs were adjusted to respond to parent feedback and our priorities were Literacy, Numeracy and Student Wellbeing, with specialist tasks optional. Our reports will reflect these changes and also comment on students' engagement with Remote Learning. The Student Effort and Behaviour sections will reflect student outcomes since they have been back onsite this term.

Whilst reading reports it has been very rewarding to see the high number of students who have made, or exceeded, the expected 6 months growth this semester in Literacy and Numeracy. I congratulate parents/carers and students for completing their home learning tasks and responding to teacher feedback given the challenges of Remote Learning. It truly has been a team effort. I also congratulate students for re-engaging with class programs on their return to school and their commitment to 'closing the gaps' in their learning. Students who have not made the expected 6 month growth this semester will be supported in their teaching and learning programs in 2022.

Student reports will be sent home Friday 10<sup>th</sup> December along with the class your child will be in next year. On Tuesday 14<sup>th</sup> December from 9:00am – 11:00am, students will have a session with their 2022 teachers and classmates. Students in grades one to six, new to the school in 2022 are also invited to attend.

The last newsletter for the year will be published on Thursday 16<sup>th</sup> December.

#### **Active Kids: Support For Families**

Does your child love sport and being active? Does your family have a Health Care Card or Pensioner Concession Card? You may be eligible for up to \$200 to put towards the cost of your child's participation in physical activities. As children return to sport over the coming months, the Get Active Kids Voucher Program helps eligible families get their kids involved in organised sport and active recreation activities.



Under the program, children may be eligible to *receive up to \$200* to help with the cost of membership and registration fees, uniforms, and equipment. The program also provides a special consideration stream to support children residing in care services as well as temporary or provisional visa holders, undocumented migrants or international students.

Applications for vouchers in round three of the program close at 5pm Tuesday 30 November. For eligibility requirements and to apply, visit the Get Active Victoria website.

## STUDENT WELL-BEING

Hi Everyone,



In the last newsletter we explored diversity in culture and how enriching cultural diversity can be in our great country, AUSTRALIA! We also noted the important values we can instil in both ourselves and our children by seeking to understand others.

Every year on 3<sup>rd</sup> of December, people around the world take part in International Day of People with Disability (IDPwD). It is a day to celebrate the achievements of people with disability and promote awareness, understanding and acceptance in the community. Celebrate this special day and make positive changes to the lives of 4.4 million Australians with disability to create a more inclusive community.



My first experience of a person with a disability was when I was in grade 2. There was a student in my class who was legally blind. Her parents must have been COURAGOUS AND PROACTIVE as I used to marvel how I would see her ride her bike along the path on weekends! Eventually she did leave to attend a school for the blind. I still remember her name and often think of her when I read of the fantastic achievements of many who are living with a disability. Many years later I was taught to play the recorder by a man who was blind since birth. Also in primary school there was an older boy who used

callipers to enable him to walk. One very wet day, he asked if he could borrow my glasses as the rain keep getting in his eyes and he couldn't wipe them! I could speak of other experiences.

Occasionally I am asked by a parent if I can work with a sibling of a child with a disability, as having a sibling with a disability can have its challenges for all family members. I empathise with these students and seek out what coping skills they have and what strategies they have when life gets a little tough at home. These families often develop strengths and skills that enable them to embrace ALL their children with love and care.





I also like to emphasise how special they are to have a sibling with a disability and what they may be learning – skills of helping, caring and responsibility. But, maybe even more importantly they are learning the values of empathy, understanding and compassion.

The journey is not an easy one and varies from family to family. But what I have discovered is that when COMMUNITY is involved the journey is a little easier.

So, let's help our children embrace those living with a disability, to further develop empathy, understanding and compassion, as well as helpfulness and kindness. A starting point may be wearing a blindfold and find our way around, or putting earplugs in our ears and finding other ways to communicate. Let's also not forget those disabilities that are more difficult to see, such as learning disabilities e.g. dyslexia, ASD and mental health disorders.

Sometimes I show students with You Tube clip of Nick Vujicic, an Australian man born with no arms and no legs – SO INSPIRATIONAL!

Peter put his engineering skills to use and made a rudimentary wheelchair for a teenager who had a disability. We can still picture the JOY in this young man's face as his friends pushed him along, sometimes letting go on quite steep slopes! FREEDOM!

So, let's continue to care for one another and make this world a better place!
