Principal's Report

It was terrific to welcome our happy campers home last week and hear all about their adventures at Weekaway and Hanging Rock. From challenging themselves and stepping out of their comfort zones on the flying fox and canoeing, or simply having fun with friends, it was clear our campers had an excellent time and built many great memories. Many students showcased their performance skills at the 'Greensborough's Got Talent' night, and I believe we may have some future stars in the making!

Thank you again to our staff and parents who generously gave their time to attend camp and ensure students had a wonderful time and returned safely it's greatly appreciated!

The fun didn't stop after camp as on Thursday we celebrated our Space Discovery unit with a visit to the Space Dome. This was a highly engaging program and a highlight for students. On yard duty and in class, the students were keen to share new concepts they'd learnt or in Jasper's words, how 'freaked out' the Prep - 2s were when the asteroids were hurtling towards them. The digital presentations the Grade 3 - 6 created demonstrating their knowledge and understandings of their Discovery Unit were impressive.



Thank you to families who assisted students to dress in space costumes on the day. This greatly added to the excitement and the gold coin donations raised \$152.50 for the Royal Children's Hospital Good Friday Appeal. This dress-up day was a JSC initiative and was a good opportunity for students to think beyond our school to help others. The profits from Friday's icy poles also went towards the Appeal and I commend JSC members on the leadership they demonstrated in this fundraiser.

It's hard to believe that tomorrow is the end of term. It's been a busy and productive term with tutoring programs in Literacy and Numeracy, as well as our usual extension, intervention, core curriculum programs and extra curricula activities including Life Education, Camp Weekaway, Inter School Sport and the Space Dome.

Robyn, our Wellbeing Worker is now in her second year with us, and her programs are well entrenched. Assisting Robyn to run Breakfast Club is another great leadership opportunity for our students. Robyn successfully obtained a grant from Headspace to run a Martial Arts program with a targeted group of Grade 5/6 students next term and is investigating other opportunities for funding.

Our new staff members have settled in well this term and are building great relationships with staff, students and family members. The school is enhanced by the new skill sets they've brought and the enthusiasm and passion they've shown for making a positive contribution to our school community. Our graduates Jill, Paula and Leo have impressed us with the start they've had to their teaching careers and are collaborating closely with their mentors.

We've been following DET guidelines and strictly implementing our COVIDsafe protocols to minimise the risk of transmission. No doubt this has assisted us to avoid the large number of staff and student absences due to workplace transmission, that has affected many schools. I'd like to thank all members of our community for working together to support this plan.

We're fervently hoping the uncertainty about school closures and pivoting to Remote Learning is a thing of the past and that we remain onsite for the rest of the year. We are absolutely committed to achieving our goals for student achievement, engagement and wellbeing and we're looking forward to welcoming parent helpers back into classrooms next term to provide further support.

Easter Parade Tomorrow

We're looking forward to our annual Easter Parade, activities and egg hunt tomorrow morning. Students have been practising their activities and are very excited about wearing their special Easter Hats and searching for eggs on the oval. Family members are welcome to attend, and pre-schoolers can also join in the fun of the parade. The Grade 6 egg toss event is a highlight of the day and our Grade 6 teachers, Paula and Erin, are keen to challenge the student winners for the overall title!

Banyule Council Community Arts Grant

Last year we successfully applied to Banyule Council for a grant to paint a mural on our fence on The Circuit that symbolises and represents intercultural understanding, language, learning and reconciliation. Jesse Stephens, Janet Troy and myself have met with Wurundjeri Artist & Muralist Coree Thorpe to develop our vision and establish a timeline. We're looking forward to beginning the project in Term Two and having our students contribute to the project during art lessons. Thank you to Jesse for his work on the grant application and Janet for helping the artist bring the work to fruition.

Southern Cross Recycling Tuesday May 3rd

Over the last two years we have had to put our recycling efforts on hold due to COVID, however we're very pleased that we're able to reinstate this valuable recycling opportunity. Families new to the school may not be aware that each term we encourage families to recycle their unwanted household goods by having a collection day at school. Our unwanted items are recycled in communities that will benefit from them and our Grade 6 students also benefit as we are paid a small amount per kilogram and the monetary proceeds are placed in the Graduation Celebration budget.

Smile Squad

Fifty-six students attended the Smile Squad Van and received free dental examinations. Many students received follow up treatment, however several parents/carers were unable to be contacted for a follow up appointment. Families can still contact Smile Squad on 9430 9100 to book into the HealthAbility Community Health Centre site. The team will return in approximately 6 months to complete fluoride treatment for the students that were indicated as a higher risk.

As I wish everyone a safe and restful holiday break, I'd like to take the opportunity to thank our students who have strived to achieve their goals this term, our committed staff who have worked tirelessly to achieve the best outcomes for our students, our families who support our school in so many ways, and Parents and Friends who generously give their time and continue to raise funds for school resources. 


The Space Dome
