Principal's Report

Once again, we've had a very smooth start to Term Two and it was wonderful to welcome everyone back and hear about their holiday adventures. The relaxing of mask rules for our staff and grade 3 - 6 students has certainly been welcomed and it's lovely to see students' facial expressions as they engage in class programs and interact with their peers and teachers.

I was very proud of our School Captains and Vice Captains last Monday when they represented our school at the ANZAC Day service at War Memorial Park. Our school leaders honoured our service men and women by laying our wreath at the cenotaph. This was a very moving ceremony, and it was terrific to see so many students from GPS in attendance with their families to commemorate the contribution of all those who have served Australia and New Zealand.

On our first day back, we held our school ANZAC Day ceremony on the netball court and Grades Prep - Six respectively listened whilst our House Captains did an exemplary job of explaining the origin of Anzac Day and what it represented. They read <u>The Prayer of Remembrance</u> and <u>The Ode</u> and laid a wreath at the base of the flag. Parents should be very proud of the mature and respectful manner in which all students participated in the service, listened to <u>The Last Post</u> and observed a minute's silence at the end.

'Step Into Prep' Transition Programs

Attached to the newsletter is a flyer with our suite of transition programs that supports pre-schoolers to transition successfully into Prep in 2023. Following on from our hugely successful 'Starting To Read' sessions last term, we are offering 2 sessions of 'Starting To Count' and a session with each of our specialist teachers. We are offering the program on Mondays - Wednesdays, so that children who attend kinder on different days, may have the opportunity to attend some, if not all, of the activities. If you know any families of 4-year-olds, please let them know about our programs, so they can ring the office and book a place.



Additional Student Free Day Term Two

Under the new Industrial Agreement, the Department of Education and Training has recently mandated schools to provide a Professional Practice Day for teachers each term. For Term 2, 2022, DET has recommended to hold each teacher's allocated Professional Practice Day on the same day for all staff. This is to enable the most effective and efficient use of this day and students are not required to attend school on this day. (Please note that this day is in addition to the two remaining curriculum days families have previously been advised of, i.e., Friday 20th May and Monday 31st October.)

We know families prefer as much advance notice as possible, of student free days, however schools are required to consult with staff and have the date approved by School Council and we are currently following this process. We will advise families early next week of the date, so that parents/carers can make suitable arrangements for the care and supervision of children. Please contact OSHClub if you wish to book your children in on this day.

Footsteps Dance Program Term Three

We like to give parents/carers advance notice of events to assist with family budgets. In Term Three, students in Grades Prep – Six will participate in the ten-week Footsteps dance program, at a cost of \$38.00 per student. The program uses dance as a vehicle to develop students' inter/intrapersonal skills, fitness levels and provide teachers with classroom resources. The program is fun and exciting for students and culminates in a performance for parents. Previously, Montmorency Secondary College donated the use of their theatre as our venue, and we are liaising with them to see if that is a possibility for this year also.

Footsteps was scheduled for last year, and cancelled due to COVID restrictions. *Families who paid for their child's Subject Contributions in 2021 have covered the cost of the program. Families new to GPS this year, and those who did not pay their full Subject Contributions last year will be sent an invoice for \$38.00 to cover the cost of the program.* Please contact the office if you have any queries.

RAT Screening Program

DET will continue to supply RATs for the first 4 weeks of Term 2 to support the early detection of COVID-19 in our school. A box with a fortnight's supply, will be sent home with each student tomorrow, Friday 29th April, unless families indicated last term that they did not want to participate in the screening.

The testing recommendations remain the same this Term for students and staff, with mainstream schools recommended to test at home twice a week.

DET Covid safe Guidelines

Information was sent to families via COMPASS on Monday outlining the following changes to COVID Safe measures for schools that will apply from the start of Term 2.

- Face masks: While recommended, are not required in any school setting. This means students in grades 3 to 6, staff and visitors in primary schools are no longer required to wear face masks. Any student or staff member who wishes to wear a mask may do so, including those who are medically at-risk.
- Screening requirements: Students who have tested positive for COVID-19, and have completed their 7-day isolation period, now do not need to undertake rapid antigen test (RAT) screening for 12 weeks after their release from isolation. This was previously 8 weeks.

- Household contacts: Students who are household contacts of a COVID-19 case are not required to quarantine. They may return to school as long as they undertake rapid antigen tests (RAT) 5 times during their 7-day period. *They are required to notify the school that they are a household contact.*
 - ★ Students aged 8 years and above who are household contacts are required to wear face masks when indoors at school unless they have a valid exemption.
 - ★ If a student household contact returns a positive RAT result, they must isolate for 7 days.
- Vaccination requirements for visitors to schools: Parents, carers and other adult visitors (not performing work) are no longer required to show evidence of two doses of COVID-19 vaccine.



Victorian High Ability Program

A key initiative of the Victorian Government has been the establishment of Student Excellence Program. Working alongside teachers and leading academics, this has seen the establishment of the Victorian High Ability Program. This program will provide an enriching learning experience to challenge and extend our high-ability students in English or Mathematics over a 10 week course and provide students with the opportunity to engage with like-minded peers.

Six of our Grade Five students are participating in a Maths Program this term . The name of this program is Patterns: From Symbols to Secrets. This course will encourage students to discover that Mathematics is not about 'getting to the answer', by demonstrating there are often multiple solutions and multiple strategies. Students will explore concepts that are not usually covered in the Primary Mathematics curriculum, such as number patterns, alternative numeral systems and cryptography. They will be pushed to view Mathematics as a process of exploration, and encouraged to ask questions, make conjectures, and test ideas.

2022 Premiers' Reading Challenge

Every year at GPS, we strongly encourage and fully support all our students to participate in the Premiers' Reading Challenge. Each and every book that a child reads continues to build their knowledge, wonderment, fluency in reading, vocabulary and comprehension.

Since the challenge began 18 years ago, Victorian children have read more than 45 million books - that is enough to fill nearly 11 Olympic swimming pools. This year children across Victoria will read at least another 4 million books.

We are excited and optimistic that our students at GPS could read a record number of books during the 2022 challenge. **In the coming weeks**, letters will be sent home to families that will provide further information regarding the Premier's Reading Challenge and these letters shall contain your child's Premiers' Reading Challenge login and password alongside a special bookmark.

In 2021, 45 students completed the challenge. This was a remarkable achievement due to Remote Learning and the closure of libraries. These students were rewarded with a certificate signed by the Premier, which was presented at our end of year assembly, and a special 'fish and chip' lunch in Term Four.

We are expecting that this year's Premiers' Reading Challenge to be bigger than ever!
