WE WANT OUR PARENTS/CAREGIVERS/GUARDIANS TO TELL US WHAT THEY THINK!

Our school is conducting a survey to find out what parents/caregivers/guardians think of our school. The Parent/Caregiver/Guardian Opinion Survey is an annual survey offered by the Department of Education and Training that is designed to assist schools in gaining an understanding of families' perceptions of school climate, student behavior, and student engagement. We encourage all families to participate in this survey. Our school will use the survey results to help inform and direct future school planning and improvement strategies.

Opinions Survey continued

This year, all families are invited to participate in the survey. The Parent/Caregiver/Guardian Opinion Survey will be conducted from **Monday 15**th **August** to **Friday 16th September.** An invitation to complete the survey will be sent home via COMPASS next Monday and only one parent/career from each family is to complete the survey.

The survey will be conducted **online**, only takes **20 minutes** to complete, and can be accessed at any convenient time within the fieldwork period on desktop computers, laptops, tablets or smartphones. The online survey will be available in a range of languages other than English. These include Arabic, Vietnamese, Simplified Chinese, Chin (Hakha), Hindi, Japanese, Somali, Turkish, Punjabi and Greek.

Parliament - Newsletter Article



The Literacy Extension Book Club were privileged to take part in a three-day long Zoom course with other schools discussing 'Should e-Scooters be Subject to More Specific Legislation.' In this Parliamentary Convention, we learnt a lot about voting and politics.

We had to submit a Yes or No vote prior to the convention and had to complete some pre-work on the subject before we attended the zoom meetings. On the first day Daniel Vigilante, (Senior Policy Officer Department of Transport) was the keynote speaker and discussed safety and environmental concerns. Not only this, we had a virtual tour of Parliament house and we saw the beautiful architecture. All the schools provided an Acknowledgement of

Country which Sienna read proudly. Kayleigh presented an opening statement, expressing our group's opinions before we started the convention, and Bella provided an impromptu speech about our opinions after hearing Daniel Vigilante.

On day two, Julia Hunter (RACV Senior Manager) and Hugo Burt-Morris (General Manager Lime E-Scooters) spoke to us, explaining their opinions. It gave us a lot to think about. Then Daniel provided a speech explaining our opinions and our conversation. The conversation we had involved age verification and talking about raising awareness to the public about the current laws. We also considered changing the age limit.

On the last day, we had a Soapbox Session. A lot was discussed. We raised points about using an app to verify age and discussed with other schools to create a fining system using safety We all collectively thought about cameras. raising the age limit and we also talked about using advertisements to get the public on the same page about the laws already in place. We had a post-program vote to see how our opinions changed. It was interesting to see the end results and how the majority of people changed their opinions. The end votes were 64 Nos and 33 Yeses. David Hodgett (Shadow Minister for Education, Early Childhood and Children, Higher Education and Training and Skills) officially closed the program, and we had the opportunity to ask him questions. Overall, it was a good experience, and we all learnt a lot.

Hi Everyone,

Sadly, like all things, social media platforms and the internet generally can be used both for 'good' and 'not good or adverse' outcomes.

On Monday, August 1st, I attended an extremely insightful seminar on 'CYBERSAFETY'. The following is not to "alarm" you, but rather to



encourage you to *SERIOUSLY* take notice, do some research via the links and talk to you children and set some SAFE interventions around the use of social media and the internet.

I really encourage you to keep reading and to find the time to click on the links below for up-to-date information and videos. The statistical information presented at the seminar was of *REAL CONCERN*, with the presenter stating that her intervention work is increasingly in **PRIMARY SCHOOLS** whereas not more than 10 years ago it was mainly in the years 10 -12 level at secondary school.



The presenter was Susan McLean, a former policewoman for 27 years. She was the first police officer to be trained and put in the position of Cyber Safety and Young People in Victoria and now has over 20 years of experience in the area of CYBERSAFETY, becoming known as 'the cyber cop'. She has also trained and worked with the FBI in the USA, especially in undercover work involving the world wide web and the inherent dangers it can present to children and young people. She is also certified with the Australian eSafety Commissioner in Australia. She works for 'CyberSafety Solutions' consulting with businesses, schools, sporting clubs and presenting seminars.

Susan did not mince words when giving real life statistics and examples of what goes on *EVERY DAY* and of some tragic outcomes! She also went over some of the laws that apply to children as young as 10, our young teens and all adults (you can find the link below).

I have worked in various schools in Melbourne, and it is *NOT JUST HAPPENING OVER THERE* – grooming, abuse, sexting, inappropriate images, etc... Some responsible developers of popular APPS such as Tik Tok, Snapchat, Instagram, Discord, Facebook, YouTube are trying to keep up with security measures but those who want to do harm find a way around these measures. Susan also noted that none of these apps and similar ones are for children under 13 years of age. Susan did note the options of YouTube Kids and Facebook for Kids.
