Principal's Report

Well done to our students for the smooth start they've had to the term! Term Four is always busy with many regular extracurricular activities, including Swimming, Grade Two Sleepover, Prep/One Breakfast, Grade 6 Excursions, Graduation and our Christmas picnic. Our Discovery unit this term is focussing on Physical and Mental Wellbeing and staff have planned events to promote our students' health and happiness. From the excitement and smiles on our Grade Two students' faces today in preparation for their sleepover tonight, and the Grade Sixes before and after their excursion, I'd say we're off to a good start.

Gratitude Diaries were introduced across the school this week as research shows that expressing gratitude (being thankful for people and situations) can improve your physical and mental health. Journalling what they are grateful for in their daily lives will be a huge boost for our students' wellbeing.

The benefits of yoga for our physical and mental health are also well documented and we are very fortunate that one of our grandparents, Jane Johnston, has over twenty years of experience teaching Yoga, Mindfulness, Meditation & working in early childhood development and will be running weekly sessions with our Grade Prep – Two students this term. Next Monday 10th October is Mental Health Day and Jane will run a session with the whole school at 10.30am on the oval. (If families have a yoga mat to send along for your child to use, that will greatly support our school supplies). The yoga session will be followed by a healthy snack. The benefits of yoga are further explained on Jane's website www.balancedkidsyoga.com.au.

The Lego Discovery room continues to promote collaboration and creative problem-solving for our students, especially the Lego Extension Group. We continue to have Breakfast Club each Wednesday morning run by our Wellbeing Worker Robyn and regular volunteers, Sarah and Tony, as well as our student leaders, Bella and Maisie, offering breakfast snacks on the other days. Our Kindness Crusaders have organised a special day next Thursday with lunchtime activities planned and our PE teacher, Leo runs a regular lunchtime sport club. With the Library opening at lunchtimes on Wednesdays, activities at the Friendship Tree each day organised by our Wellbeing Leaders, coding, tennis and choir rehearsals, our students have many opportunities both in class time and during breaks, to develop their mental and physical health.

Shade Sail Completion

We were very excited to see the new shade sail installed during the week. I'm sure you'll agree it has greatly enhanced the amphitheatre area and will be of great benefit to our students. The provision of shade over the seating is not only SunSmart, it gives teachers another terrific outdoor learning space to use.



Greensborough Walk Excursion

Next Friday 14th October, twenty of our Grade 3/4 volunteers will again have the opportunity to support our community by watering the gardens in Greensborough Walk in front of Watermarc. This is a Banyule Council initiative and our students are eager to continue in the program and attend during their lunch hour. Banyule Council is keen to promote Greensborough Walk and **Rediscover Local**, and, as a thank you to our students, they will again run an exercise session for us in the large promenade area, followed by a snack. After our previous visit, Banyule Council staff were high in their praise of our students' behaviour and appreciative of their support.



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Staffing Profile

Our planning for 2023 is gaining momentum and below is our proposed grade structure for 2023 based on all the information we currently have for staffing and enrolments. You'll note that there are several changes to our staffing profile, and we're very pleased we can confirm Bronwyn Seedeem accepted ongoing employment as 0.2 Visual Arts teacher and that STEM will be scheduled P- 6 on a weekly basis, as is PE.

Jesse Stephens has changed to Grade 5/6 as we have a professional responsibility to consider staff requests to teach different grade levels to further develop their professional practice and knowledge. Over the holidays we were advised of a further change and we congratulate Erin Donaldson who has been successful in applying for a new position in 2023. We know Erin has been seeking further leadership opportunities and we support her decision to attain her goals in her teaching career. Erin will be on 12 months leave from DET and we are currently advertising for a 12-month fixed term position.

Teachers have asked students to nominate friendship groups so we can begin the process of allocating students to their 2023 grades. This is a very lengthy process, and we need this information to assist us with our planning. The process also includes teachers' consideration of students' friendship groups, school data on academic abilities and needs, and parent input on specific requests for their children.

We will be finalising grades by October 24th, so we can begin handover of student information from this year's teacher to next. *Therefore, if parents or caregivers have any specific requests for next year it's very important that you send in your requests via email, phone, handwritten note or in person, to the office, Margaret or myself **by Friday October 21st*** so this can be factored into decision making. We are usually able to accommodate requests, however if not, parents will be contacted to discuss further, before grades are finalised.

Notification of 2023 grades will be sent home with reports on **Friday December 9th** and students will meet their 2023 teachers and spend the morning with them on **Tuesday 13th December**.

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Southern Cross Recycling

This term we will be collecting items for Southern Cross Recycling on **Tuesday 8th November** to coincide with Recycling Week. There have been significant changes to what SCR will collect and recycle. We ask families to only bring clean, wearable clothing, shoes, hats, handbags, belts, accessories, toys, towels, sheets, pillowcases and doona covers. **Books, DVDs, CDs and household items are NO longer able to be sent along.** A flyer has been included later in the newsletter explaining clarifying what can/can't be collected and what happens to the donated items. We ask families to please only send along the listed items, as we have to pay for the removal of items not collected.

Southern Cross pays us an amount based on the weight of items which goes towards Grade 6 Graduation celebrations. Prior to collection, if any families spy a 'treasure' in the recycled goods they would like to take home, just contact the office to make a donation. As we are paid by weight, a gold or silver coin donation would be sufficient.

Smile Squad six-month fluoride varnish visit

The HealthAbility Smile Squad team are heading back to our school to complete six-monthly fluoride varnish applications for those students who have provided consent. Fluoride varnish applications help make sure students have the best chance of preventing tooth decay, so we're excited Smile Squad are coming back.

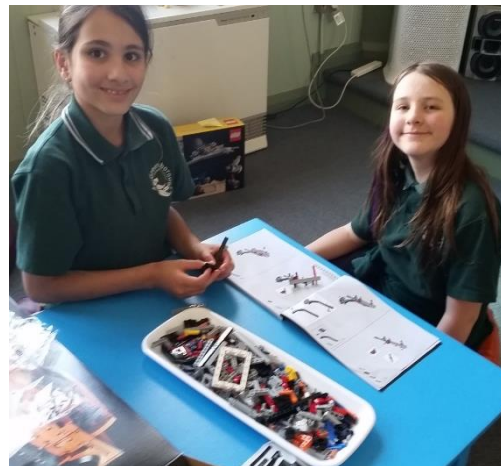

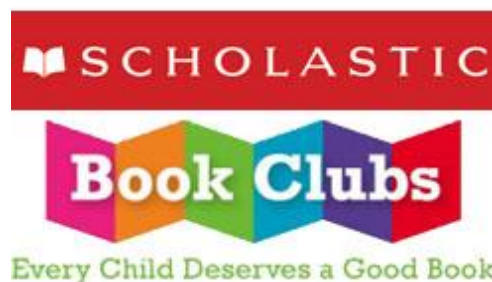

Recycle With Mondo is a fun, simple and educational fundraising program presented by SCRgroup. This program supports Australian pre-schools, schools and clubs to raise thousands of dollars each year while diverting reusable items from landfill and providing global communities with affordable clothing and employment.

How it works:

1. You can host Clothing Hubs at your school by completing our registration form online. SCRgroup will visit your schools to perform a site assessment and will place a clothing hub onsite within a 2-4 week period or Book your collection dates for each term.
2. Receive your FREE Education Kit including promotional flyers and posters.
3. Distribute your promotional flyers to your school community.
4. Your hub/s will be serviced as needed.
5. Your school receives \$0.10 cents per kilogram for the items collected.
6. At the end of every term, you'll be emailed a School Ladder, which shows how your school is tracking alongside other schools around Australia.

What can be collected?

All clean, wearable children's and adult's clothing, shoes, hats, handbags, belts, accessories, toys, towels, sheets, pillowcases and doona covers.

What can't be collected?

Wet, dirty, torn items, doonas, pillows, books, DVDs, CDs and household items.

What happens to the clothes?

Clothing collected is sorted for reuse and recycling. They are distributed in Australia and globally to maximise their reuse and recycling potential, providing employment, affordable clothing and improving livelihoods in developing countries. Items that can not be reused are recycled into wiper rags or converted into a biofuel (24%). SCRgroup is working on programs to divert 100% from landfill.

Why reuse and recycle?

- Divert from Landfill
- Natural fibres like wool and cotton will decompose and create methane, a greenhouse gas which causes climate change.
- Saves resources such as cotton and wool as well as oil which is used to make synthetic clothing such as nylon and polyester.
