### Principal's Report

It was lovely to see the excited faces of the Prep and Grade One students as they arrived at school for breakfast at 8am this morning dressed in their PJs and clutching their favourite 'Teddy'. Our annual events are so important for the joy and sense of connectedness they bring to our students and are a highly anticipated and a highlight of their schoolyear.

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Another highlight for our students is seeing the Grade 5/6 artwork displayed on the hoardings at the Greensborough Station renovations, which are part of the Hurstbridge rail line duplication project. Earlier in the year our senior students collaborated to create a series of six artworks and it's wonderful for them to see their work displayed in such a prominent position for the Banyule Community to enjoy. I congratulate the students and their teachers for the excellent quality of their finished projects.



Whilst we're celebrating student achievement, I'd like to congratulate brothers, Kobe and Raiden who recently competed in their first Judo competition, and both were medal winners! Raiden won a gold medal and Kobe a silver medal in their respective divisions. Their coach at Yarra Judo Club was high in his praise of the boys' determination and effort and we wish the boys continued enjoyment and success.



### **Student Leadership**

We are currently in full swing with preparation for 2023 formal student leadership positions. The Expressions of Interest for the Student Wellbeing Leaders were handed out last week and once positions are finalised, we'll begin training in the next few weeks. Students are also busily preparing their speeches for School and House Captains which will be delivered on November 28<sup>th</sup> and December 5<sup>th</sup> respectively.

### **RSL Scholarships**

Each year Watsonia RSL supports our school by offering scholarships to two of our Grade Six students. The scholarships are awarded to students who have displayed excellent leadership skills and have been role models for their peers. I am very proud to announce that Holly and Daniel, our School Captains, are this year's worthy recipients and congratulate them on behalf of our community. Holly and Daniel will represent our school at the Remembrance Day ceremony, at the Watsonia RSL on Friday, November 11<sup>th</sup>, at 10.30am. This very moving service will consist of speeches by veterans, followed by our students laying a wreath with other community groups. An award ceremony will then take place followed by light refreshments. Congratulations Holly and Daniel!

### **Remembrance Day**

As Remembrance Day falls on a Friday this year and our students will be in transit for swimming classes, we will hold our whole school memorial service at 01:25pm rather than the usual 11:00am. Grades Prep - Six will gather on the netball court, weather permitting, to observe one minute's silence to remember the men and women who have served Australia in all wars and armed conflicts. Our School Vice-Captains, Evelyn, Will, and Sienna will read the Ode of Remembrance and place a wreath at the base of our flagpole.

### **Staffing**

2023 Visual Arts position: Bronwyn has regrettably advised that she is unable to take on the role of the 2023 Visual Arts teacher. Working across several schools is proving more challenging than expected and we respect her decision and wish Bronwyn all the best in her future endeavours. Bronwyn is a terrific addition to our community and whilst she will only be with us for this term, her work with students will have longevity as they complete the artwork for the mural on our fence line. We look forward to working with Bronwyn for the remainder of this term.

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The good news is that when we interviewed for the arts position, we had another excellent applicant, Kristy Bedford, who strongly impressed us and was ranked second by a narrow margin. We were so impressed by Kristy we offered her the SEL position this term and we're pleased that Kristy has agreed, and is excited, to also take on the role of Visual Arts teacher for 2023. Kristy has also been a valuable addition to our staff this term and we look forward to her increasing her role in 2023.

**2023 Grade 3/4 position:** The interview process for the Grade 3/4 teaching position has been finalised and once the 14-day provisional period has passed, we'll be able to announce the successful candidate to families. We're very excited to welcome our new teacher to our GPS community and the timing of the appointment allows us to have a thorough induction, including handover of student information. Our new staff member will also join the grade for the 'Meet the Teacher' morning on Tuesday 13<sup>th</sup> December.

## **2023 Camp**

We are very pleased that we can continue with our 2023 camping program whilst still meeting the provisions of the new Victorian Government Schools Agreement (VGSA), which requires teachers to have time in lieu for working hours beyond their normal work schedule. As has been widely publicised in the media, schools have not been given additional funding to cover replacement teaching staff to cover accrued time in lieu, and many schools have reluctantly cancelled their camp program. As camps are a valuable event in students' school lives and build students' engagement, connectedness to peers, interpersonal and intrapersonal skills, Margaret and I have investigated every possible option to retain our camping program without impacting students' learning or the budgets of other school programs. The only viable option at this stage, is for Margaret and I to cover classes and a schedule has been created for this to occur. Whilst this will increase our workload, the alternative to cancel camp, was not an option we wished to take. We join with other schools hoping that DET will provide schools with funds in 2023 so that we can fulfill the requirements of the VGSA in a sustainable manner.

## **Student Support Groups**

Last week a post was sent on COMPASS to parents of children who have Student Support Group (SSG) meetings to arrange an appointment for this term. We ask all families who would like a meeting, to reply promptly to their classroom teacher, so we can finalise our SSG schedule.

## **Semester Two Reports**

We are revising the layout and format of our Semester Two reports, to ensure reports are consistent with the practice of other schools and completed within teachers' usual work hours, as per the new Victorian Government Schools Agreement. This format will use the templates available in COMPASS.

The report will contain:

- Progression Points: as per previous reports
- Front page: retaining student progress as per previous reports, for Discovery, leadership, interpersonal and personal capabilities, PATHS/Respectful Relationships etc.
- Revised: Literacy, Numeracy and Specialist subjects
  - A description of the content of the teaching and learning program specific for that semester, e.g., focus on STEM-coding, Literacy-narratives, PE-basketball.
  - Curriculum outcome statements relevant to progression point student is working towards, with progress shown as 'With Support, Beginning, Consolidated or Established'
  - Area for Improvement or Future Learning

We will trial this new format this semester and review for Semester Two, 2023.

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## Prep Transition

We're looking forward to welcoming our 2023 Preps and their parents/carers to their first transition session tomorrow Friday 4<sup>th</sup> November. These sessions provide us with the opportunity to get to know each student and begin to build relationships with our new families. Over the next few weeks, Jill will make contact and visit the kindergartens our future students are currently at, to complete the handover of information to ensure a successful transition from kindergarten to school for our 2023 Preps. Our current Prep students attending Swimming with Mrs Mac whilst Jill engages with our new students.

## Southern Cross Recycling

This term we will be collecting items for Southern Cross Recycling next Tuesday 8<sup>th</sup> November to coincide with Recycling Week. There have been significant changes to what SCR will collect and recycle. We ask families to only bring clean, wearable clothing, shoes, hats, handbags, belts, accessories, toys, towels, sheets, pillowcases and doona covers. Books, DVDs, CDs and household items are no longer able to be sent along. A flyer has been provided previously clarifying what can/can't be collected and what happens to the donated items. We ask families to please only send along the listed items, as we have to pay for the removal of items that Southern Cross Recycling will not collect.

Southern Cross pays us an amount based on the weight of items which goes towards Grade 6 Graduation celebrations. Prior to collection, if any families spy a 'treasure' in the recycled goods they would like to take home, just contact the office to make a donation. As we are paid by weight, a gold or silver coin donation would be sufficient.
