Principal's Report

Congratulations to our Prep students as they're completing their first fulltime fortnight at school! I commend the preps, Jill and parents, on how well they have settled into class routines and begun to build friendship groups. It's always a pleasure to visit the Prep classroom and see their excitement at learning new skills, and their pride and enthusiasm to share their efforts.

We were very excited last Friday when the refurbishment of the outside toilets and staff toilets were completed. Our students were very impressed with the new décor and one of our Grade 1/2 students summed everyone's feelings up beautifully when he said, 'Wow, they're like rich people's toilets!'

Work has begun on the indoor toilets and we're looking forward to their completion. The removal works have been quite noisy this week and classes adjacent to the project were able to move to the classrooms in the heritage building. The rebuilding and installation stages are expected to be quieter.

Emergency Management and Anaphylaxis Drills

Student safety is very important to us at Greensborough Primary and each term we practise emergency management drills. This includes evacuations, lock-ins and treatment of an anaphylactic reactions in the yard or classroom. Prior to our drills, teachers discuss correct procedures in a sensitive and age-appropriate manner with their grades. Each time we rehearse we commend our students on their calm, prompt responses. Our OH&S Rep, Claire E., acts as an observer to our drills and completes a DET checklist so that we can acknowledge what's working well and address any areas for improvement. Whilst none of the staff have ever had to evacuate or administer an epipen to a student in our teaching careers, being prepared is always our best management option.

NAPLAN 2023 - Grade 3 & 5

Dear Families.

This year the NAPLAN Testing window has changed. Following on from the first successful NAPLAN Online last year, the NAPLAN Testing window is now held between **Wednesday 15th March** & **Monday 27th March**.

Fortunately, schools have been given greater flexibility when it comes to the facilitation of **NAPLAN**, as well as students given the opportunity to complete adaptive assessments online. This means that the assessment itself adapts to the way your child answers the NAPLAN questions, giving a greater snapshot of their current learning level and ability. I am writing today to let you know our current plans and provide you with some additional information that is relevant if your child is in Grade 3 and/or Grade 5 and sitting NAPLAN this year.



Yes, 'it takes a village to raise a child' but a parent's


influence is most important in the early years, including during their primary education years, more important than any school Principal or Teacher and Support Staff.

Despite peers becoming increasingly important, parents' early influences (*positive and negative*) primarily remain as children become young people making choices for themselves.


