Art Extension and Friendship Tree Garden



DVCS services currently include a Back-to-School Program, which provides eligible families a cheque for **\$100 per child** (up to \$500 per family). The cheque will be made out to the school, and is to be used for educational purposes, i.e., Subject Contributions, camps, excursions, and so on. 


I wish you all a special time of renewal and hope this Easter.
