Principal's Report

We've had a terrific start to Term Two and it's hard to believe this is only our second week back! We've welcomed Alessia Celotti, our new Grade 1/2 teacher, and she's had a seamless transition to our school and her new classroom. Laura and Alessia had a thorough handover process and Alessia already has built great relationships with students.

Students from Prep – Grade Six are highly engaged in our usual class and specialist programs and several extra-curricular programs have already begun or are in the planning stage. Twenty of our highly numerate Grade 3 – 6 students are participating in the Junior Maths Olympiad program. This program is specifically designed to stimulate and challenge students at primary school level. It teaches 'major problem-solving strategies and strengthens students' mathematical intuition. The competition runs for 4 weeks and we wish our students well.

Discovery units are well underway and we're looking forward to the 'History Box' incursion later in the term . Our Prep class is currently enjoying the Junior School Clubs Program involving arts, crafts and sporting activities. Cross Country trials were held last week and Grade 3 – 6 students are to be congratulated for trying their best to run the required 2km or 3km distances, and for their excellent behaviour which ensured the trials ran smoothly. The team has been selected and students have begun training and I commend them for coming early and training before school. PIT Gymnastics is booked for our Grade P - 4 students during Physical Education lessons later in the term, courtesy of a Sports in Schools grant and our Canine Comprehension program has begun with a small group of students in Grade 5/6. The Resilience Project and Respectful Relationships Programs are continuing to be embedded and student are actively practising Gratitude, Empathy and Mindfulness to improve their emotional wellbeing and mental health.

We are very excited that our 'Tiny Town' is under construction and we hope that it will be completed and installed on the lower half of 'the oval' by the end of this term. Families may remember we received a grant from the Northeast Link Project and students will soon have their own hospital, café and other services to enjoy in their imaginative games and play. See our plan later in the newsletter.

Thank you to Parents and Friends for organising the Mother's Day stall next Friday. Many hours are spent wrapping and preparing presents for our children to give to a very special person in their lives on Sunday 14th May. It's lovely every year when we see the joy it brings students as they select their 'perfect gifts'. Many thanks to Kate and her band of helpers for organising this event, as it's as much about building happy memories for our students and families, as it is about raising funds . Our Preps have a Mother's Day afternoon tea planned for their special visitors on Friday afternoon and we're looking forward to seeing them 'pamper' their loved ones.

DVCS services currently include a Back-to-School Program, which provides eligible families a cheque for **\$100 per child** (up to \$500 per family). The cheque will be made out to the school, and is to be used for educational purposes, i.e., Subject Contributions, camps, excursions, and so on. STUDENT WELLBEING

Hi Everyone!

KEEPING UP YOUR CHILD'S EXCITEMENT FOR LEARNING!

Welcome to term two! Do you find that your child's enthusiasm begins with excitement as a new school year begins then gradually, or in some circumstances rapidly, wanes? This week, I thought I would make some suggestions to help you to keep up your child's enthusiasm up or to increase it.

- 1. Write a pick-me-up note in your child's lunchbox or backpack (*or both*) I have attached a page of notes you can print.
- 2. Play fun and upbeat music in the car on your way to school.
- **3.** Enrol your child in activities outside of school so they have something special to look forward to each week. Just remember to avoid overscheduling this can cause burnout even quicker!
- **4.** Give your child frequent positive feedback about the effort they put into their schoolwork. Even if they aren't happy with their outcome of a project, hearing your praise will motivate them more for the next one!
- **5.** Have designated 'family time' at least once a week. This can help kids relax and unwind from the stresses of school so they can go into the classroom the next day on a positive note.
- 6. Be enthusiastic! If they're learning about the life cycle of a butterfly, pull up videos on your computer and get excited yourself. When your kids see that, they'll realize just how fascinating learning is! And who knows you may even learn something new!
- 7. If your child is disinterested in what they're currently studying in school, try to find simple, yet creative ways to connect those lessons to something they love. If they loathe math but love art, go to an art museum and talk about the shapes in the paintings, or do more advanced math to calculate the age of certain artifacts. Even a trip to a playground lots of shapes there and counting activities.
- **8.** Create a designated homework station in your home. Have fun folders, paperclips, sticky notes, or anything else that will brighten up homework time while ensuring they can stay focused and organised.

To help your children live up to their potential, check in with them about how school is going. Let them know that you are there if they need help with homework. With older children be sure to give them space, too. If they sense that you are pressuring them, they might end up feeling resentful and less motivated.

Positive reinforcement helps – high 5s, hugs. Praise **EFFORT** not **RESULTS**, for example, praise for finishing a tough project or for doing their best. Make sure your child knows you don't expect perfection.

Finally, be sure to keep tabs on your own feelings. If you are getting very frustrated or angry with your child's performance, your child will pick it up – children are very sensitive to the negative emotions of others.



Let's continue to work together as a 'community' to help our students be the best they can be, especially as they grow into confident and caring young people!
