Alternatively, students could arrive at school and walk some laps around the buildings, chatting to friends, before enjoying Breakfast Club organised by our students, Bella, Maisie and Jackson.





Being active on a regular basis is important for us and we thank Leo Derrick for purchasing soccer goals for our students to enjoy during recess and lunch breaks. We have a large contingent of soccer enthusiasts from all grade levels and I'm sure they'll enjoy the new nets during breaks and Physical Education lessons. We are very grateful to the members of Greensborough's 'Inner Wheel' and Bundoora Rotary for providing financial support to GPS students. Both organisations have donated \$1500 to support our students and programs. We are looking forward to further extending our relationships with these philanthropic

organisations who recognise our existing efforts to support families and are keen to assist us in our endeavours.

Thank you to Robyn, our Wellbeing Worker for assisting us to liaise with these organisations, as well as coordinate other programs to support our students' wellbeing. Our Breakfast Club Program is extremely popular each week and Robyn and her loyal volunteers are warming students with baked bean toasties,

scrambled eggs, cereal and toast in the hall each Wednesday. Our student leaders are serving fruit cups, homemade muffins and milk drinks every other day, at the front entrance.

Pictured is Therapy Dog Norma, the star of our Canine Comprehension program. Therapy Dogs touch us psychologically, emotionally, mentally and physically. The presence of a dog increases our oxytocin, dopamine and serotonin levels, helping us self-regulate, concentrate and feel more optimistic. These benefits impact many aspects of our students' lives, including a willingness to join in, resilience, positive relationships, connection to community, self-awareness and empathy. We are grateful to Headspace for the grant which funds this program.



Volunteers To Support P – 2 Class Programs

If any parents would like to volunteer to assist in class programs in our Junior school, please contact your child's class teacher or leave your name at the office. Our P - 2 students would greatly benefit from volunteers listening to them read, changing readers or practising their Magic Words in the morning Literacy session. The benefits of students reading aloud to an adult are well documented and we know this often isn't possible at home for all families. Listening to students read supports their fluency and understanding of texts, and we appreciate the assistance of parent helpers.

Information will be sent home via COMPASS in the next fortnight for parents/carers to book a time for their Interviews. If any parents/carers experience difficulty with the COMPASS booking process, please contact the office for assistance. Families with more than one student attending GPS are advised to book early so that you are able to arrange sessions close together, rather than have large time gaps between meetings. So as not to inconvenience families, meetings will need to run on time and adhere to the ten-minute time allowance, therefore if any parents require additional time, a further meeting can be arranged on another date.

Attitudes To School Survey

We value Student Voice as a means to improving student engagement, wellbeing and quality instruction, and over the next fortnight, we are conducting a survey to find out what children in Grades 4 - 6 think of our school. The Attitudes to School Survey is an annual student survey offered by the Department of Education and Training to assist schools in gaining an understanding of students' perceptions and experience of school. Term Two Updates

Many thanks to the school families who have paid the \$200 per student for the 2023 Parent Payment.

As always, we work extremely hard to make every educational dollar go as far as it can and, as can be seen in the attached document, it is very clear where every dollar is being spent. You will note that included in the \$200 total of the 2023 Parent Payment (see below) is the \$50 cost for the Term Three Footsteps Dance incursion and bus costs for the end of term performance. As is the case with any excursion /incursion, for those families who have not yet paid the Parent Payment, the \$50 cost of the Footsteps Program will need to be paid before the incursion sessions beginning in Term Three. Those families with CSEF funding can use this to pay for Footsteps if they would like to do so.

We recognise that it is frustrating for families to not receive a statement of costs outstanding and payments made, however, as part of the Education Departments new Parent Payment Policy we are unable to issue statements. If you are unsure if you have made payments or would like clarification, please contact Mehgan and she can provide details of your school account and give you a paper copy if you request one.

On a happy note, there will be no charge for the 2023 swimming program. The school diligently put aside the Government contributions to swimming costs during the Pandemic (when we were unable to attend WaterMarc) and this means we now have the funds to cover the total cost of the program. Usually, our swimming program is in Term Four but, due to a booking error by WaterMarc, for this year, we will have six Friday sessions in the second half of Term Three and two sessions at the start of Term Four. Closer to the time, exact dates and session times will be provided to families.

To bring everyone up to date with the time frame for the toilet redevelopment program. We have been assured that the boys' indoor toilets will be completed on Wednesday 24th May 2023, with a final inspection on the 25th May 2023. The girls' indoor toilets are scheduled for completion on the 5th June 2023.

Also, for those families who have inquired about the fencing outside 3/4A, the window frames in the foyer have some rot in them and we are awaiting confirmation from the Education Department if the Department is going to repair/replace these, or if this is a task that the school is expected to complete. In the meantime, the fencing is there as a precautionary measure in the slight off chance that one of the frames gives way and falls.

Home Reading Program

At the core of the Reading program at Greensborough Primary is the goal of ensuring all students have the skills and strategies to both read accurately AND have a love of reading. The Home Reading program aims to ensure that students read at home to build up fluency, comprehension and to delve deeper into 'of interest' reading material.

To support this goal, teachers from Grades Prep to Four will ensure that appropriate reading material is coming home with students each night. We hope that parents or carers will be able to assist students to write in their diaries as these will be checked weekly by class teachers. Students in Grades 5 to 6 who are independent and engaged readers will be encouraged to continue their home reading schedule and to record this in their diaries. Students in Grades 5 to 6 who are not currently reading at home, will be provided with ability-based texts to ensure that they have the opportunity to hone their skills and gain pleasure from reading at home.

If it is identified by class teachers that students are not reading at home, students will have an additional 30 minutes of reading time in the Library at lunchtimes on Monday.

If there is any way we can provide further strategies or information to assist you with supporting students reading at home, please let your child's class teacher know and we will do the best we can to provide assistance.
