#### Semester Two Staffing

Our class teachers new to Greensborough Primary in 2023, Alessia and Vanessa, are doing a fabulous job and have enjoyed their first semester of teaching. Their grades are thriving, and we congratulate them on a successful start to their career. Vanessa, however, had always expressed the desire to teach part time and now we have been able to hire an excellent, experienced teacher to share the grade with her.

We have appointed Kate Crilly as our new 0.4 classroom teacher. Kate has worked at GPS this year as a Casual Relief Teacher and has begun to build strong relationships with staff and students. Kate is familiar with our school programs and has proven to be an excellent teacher. She comes highly recommended from her previous school and we welcome her to GPS.

Families of students in Grade 3/4B were advised earlier today and we'll have a thorough induction prior to Kate starting. Both Kate and Vanessa are looking forward to working together as class teachers of Grade 3/4B. Kate will work Monday – Tuesdays, and Vanessa will work Wednesday – Friday.

#### **Curriculum Overview**

I was very impressed yesterday when I visited the Grade 5/6 classrooms during their History Expo. Students were very knowledgeable about the Gold Rush and Eureka Rebellion and their journals reflected a strong knowledge of life during this period of Australian history. Students proudly shared their work with staff and students from other grades and their enthusiasm and engagement in their work was very evident.

Students in Grade 3 - 6 also attended a webinar by author Andy Griffiths this week, who shared his journey to become a successful writer and P – 2 students had a session with Matt Cosgrove. This capped off what's been a busy and productive term, as staff worked collaboratively to plan and deliver engaging learning tasks for their classes, including excursions, incursions and Discovery Units, as well as regular class programs.

Our suite of Extension, Intervention and Tutoring programs offer students additional support to reach their potential. The Victorian High-Ability Program and Challenge and Enrichment Series is continuing to engage and extend selected students and the Maths Olympiad is an excellent opportunity for our highly numerate students to showcase their talent. The Premier's Reading Challenge has begun, and the P – 2 Clubs program is a highlight of their week.

Student Voice and Agency is being developed through our Kindness Crusaders, the Friendship Tree and Junior School Council. We're looking forward to the 'Ice Bucket Challenge' JSC is coordinating to raise funds to find a cure for Motor Neurone Disease. This is a very worthy cause and I commend the JSC for raising our awareness. Information about this fundraiser is included later in this newsletter.

Planning for next term's programs is well underway and this includes our swimming and dance lessons. The ten dance lessons with Footsteps Dance Company are included in our Parent Payments, as is the cost of the bus to Montmorency Secondary College for our performance. Families who have not paid this year's Parent Payment are required to pay \$50 for the dance program and transport cost.

Also next term, we have our Book Week celebrations which are a highlight of our school year and our annual poetry competition. Margaret is currently liaising with teachers to finalise names of students requiring additional support in oral language, numeracy or literacy, and also those students requiring extension. Lunchtime programs of Chessmate, P - 6 Coding and Tennis P - 6 are also available for students to book into by contacting the external providers.

#### Reporting and Parent/Teacher Interviews Wednesday 21st June

Thank you to the staff for their diligence and hard work in evaluating student results and writing reports. Staff spend many hours on this process and whilst it is a normal part of their role as teachers, they have demonstrated their deep knowledge of the students they teach and reported accurately to parents so that our students' social and academic progress can be celebrated. Areas for improvement and future learning were also identified and these will be the focus for future learning in Semester Two.

#### Hi Everyone,
