I'd especially like to welcome our new staff member Kate Crilly, who is grade sharing with Vanessa in 3/4B, and our five new students and families, who have already given feedback about how much they are enjoying our GPS community. It's a credit to our students how they have supported and befriended their new classmates.

Thank you to everyone who supported the JSC fundraiser at the end of Term Two. The 'Ice Bucket Challenge' raised \$715 for Motor Neuron Disease Research and brought a great deal of enjoyment to our community. The looks on our students' faces as they playfully told teachers they had voted for them were priceless! Thank you to staff who nominated for the challenge and to Leo for being a good sport and enduring the ice water. Special mention to our JSC members who promoted the event and manned the voting table in the mornings before school. They should be very proud of the leadership they showed.



Extra-Curricular Programs

As well as our usual class programs this term we have a host of extracurricular activities and events planned. As NAIDOC Week falls in the holidays, we always celebrate first week back and class programs are celebrating the histories, cultures and achievements of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people. Students have been given wrist bands to help raise their awareness of the importance of this week and our Wellbeing Leaders are also running activities at the Friendship Tree.



Our Preps will soon be celebrating **100 days of Prep!** This milestone occurs on Friday 28th July and Jill has planned a terrific day for her class. Book Week activities are a highlight of our year and Frankie, our Librarian, has the planning for the Book Fair, Multi-Age Day and Dress-Up Parade, well in hand. Our annual Poetry Competition coincides with Book Week and we're looking forward to enjoying reading the poems students submit. Grades 3 – 6 are busy developing their athletics skills in preparation for trials and the District Carnival and Grade 6 students will begin their Graduation preparation in earnest.



Programs run by external providers of Instrumental Music, Chess, Coding and Tennis have begun and we also have our lunchtime school activities at the Friendship Tree, Sports Club and board games in the Library with Robyn, our Wellbeing Worker. We're very excited that Robyn has organised for Jesse and Therapy Dog, Pixie, to join the program on Mondays. Pixie received a warm welcome from students who are looking forward to her return each week.

Our Footsteps Dance Program will begin tomorrow and continue for the rest of term, culminating in a concert on Tuesday morning, 29th August for family members to attend. The cost of the ten dance lessons are included in our Parent Payments, as is the cost of the bus to Montmorency Secondary College for our performance. Families who have not made this payment are asked to contact the office to arrange a payment plan.

We have a change in our timetable for swimming this year and lessons will begin this term and continue in Term Four. Margaret has advised families there is no cost for swimming as we are able to use funds saved from COVID years when swimming was not held. Parents who would like to assist with supervising students as we walk to and from swimming are asked to contact class teachers. A volunteer Working With Children Card (WWCC) is required if parents enter change rooms to help students.

The Victorian High-Ability Program and Challenge and Enrichment Series and GATEWAYS events are being organised by Claire Storey and our usual extension, tutoring and intervention programs are continuing. Jesse Stephens is working with a group of Grade 5/6 students to participate in Tournament of The Minds, which is a program for Grade 5/6 students providing them opportunity to solve authentic, open-ended challenges that foster creative, divergent thinking whilst developing collaborative skills.

Overall, it will be a productive term with programs designed to meet our students' academic and wellbeing needs.

Student Wellbeing Boost

Stay tuned for information about an exciting new project we have planned for this term and 2024. Schools have been given additional one-off funding for extra resources and initiatives to support the mental health and wellbeing of our students, which was impacted by the COVID-19 pandemic and successive lockdowns. We're looking forward to spending this funding to boost student's wellbeing.

Upcoming changes to NAPLAN reporting

Ahead of NAPLAN results for students being released from Monday 17 July 2023, DET is asking schools to inform families of some changes to this year's reporting. These are changes being introduced nationally by the Australian Curriculum Assessment and Reporting Authority (ACARA).

NAPLAN will continue to measure student achievement in numeracy, reading, writing, spelling, and grammar and punctuation but the results will now be presented in 4 proficiency levels:

These are:

- S Exceeding
- Strong
- Developing
- Needs additional support

This change is designed to give schools, parents and carers clearer information that details student achievement against new proficiency levels. Students' NAPLAN reports will continue to show how they are tracking against their peers and provide an indication of their skill levels against national averages and where we would expect them to be in order to get the most out of schooling. This will provide valuable information to teachers about how we can continue to support your child.

Each set of NAPLAN results is an important milestone but it's also important that students know that one result does not define them – these results are about making sure every student gets the support they need so they can continue to get the best from their learning.

When parents are provided with your child's results, you will also receive information about what the new proficiency levels mean.

Schools have only been advised of the changes in this week's bulletin and information sessions for school staff will be held this term.

We are currently facing the same difficulty all schools are experiencing in recent years in employing a language teacher. We are currently readvertising for a Mandarin teacher and hope we have a successful outcome so we can reintroduce Mandarin lessons this semester. We'll keep families advised of the outcome.

FROM DET: Stay well this Winter

In Victoria, influenza (flu) and respiratory syncytial virus (RSV) infection numbers are high among children aged 5 to 11 years, particularly in those in their first few years of school. The Victorian Department of Health expects more respiratory infections over Term 3.

Most children with flu or RSV have a mild fever, runny nose or cough. Some children, particularly babies and children with underlying medical conditions, may have more severe illness.

Keeping our school community well

Parents, carers and students are encouraged to:

- Wash and sanitise their hands regularly
- Avoid touching eyes, nose and mouth with unwashed hands
- Cover their nose and mouth when coughing or sneezing stay at home if unwell and consult a general practitioner (GP) or NURSE-ON-CALL as needed
- Stay up to date with flu and COVID-19 vaccinations

Our school has masks for staff, students and visitors if they want to wear them.

Flu vaccinations

Vaccination is the best way to protect yourself and your family from getting the flu. Annual flu vaccination is recommended for everyone aged 6 months and older. As part of the National Immunisation Program, it is free for:

- Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people aged 6 months and older
- Children aged 6 months to under 5 years
- People aged 6 months or older with underlying medical conditions.

Flu vaccinations can be booked through GPs, pharmacies or your local council immunisation service.

We have already had a number of enquiries and school tours for places in 2024 and the sooner we get a sense of our intake for next year, the sooner we can start planning for grade structures.

Greensborough Primary School regularly reviews and updates our policies and procedures to ensure they meet the Department's requirements. These are available on the school website, or a hard copy can be obtained from the office.




