### **Principal's Report**

On Tuesday we held the final day of our School Review and the review panel has been high in their praise of Greensborough Primary. School Reviews are conducted every 4 years and inform the direction of the new 4-year Strategic Plan. The Review Panel consists of Challenge Partners, who are Principal Class members from other schools, our Senior Education Improvement Leader from Region, School Council President and an Independent Reviewer. The panel look at achievement data from the previous 4 years, conduct interviews with staff, parents and students and visit classrooms to observe teaching and learning programs. They evaluate our progress towards attaining the goals of our previous Strategic Plan and give feedback to set the goals and targets for the next four years.

The panel commented on our excellent student learning outcomes over the last 4 years, which were achieved despite the lengthy periods of Remote Learning. Members noted the high levels of student engagement and

the positive relationships between students and staff. They noted evidence of High Impact Teaching Strategies (HITS) in their classroom visits and the supportive relationship with parents . Praise was high for the calm, orderly learning environment and the excellent state of buildings and grounds. We are proud of our programs and achievements at GPS and it was terrific to see Principal Class from other schools taking photos of our learning environments and asking if they could send staff from their school to see some of our programs in action and have our staff share their expertise.

The Review Panel agreed with our self-evaluation of our progress over the last 4 years and acknowledged that we already knew what our future goals and targets would be and had our planning for key improvement strategies in place. Our planning for 2024 is well underway and it was acknowledged that there were 'no surprises' in this review... we knew our priorities for our next 4 years and had already begun the work to achieve them.

We'd like to thank students, staff and parents, for the contribution everyone has made to making GPS an outstanding school!

### Active To School Month

On Monday 13<sup>th</sup> November we join Banyule Council's 'Active To School' program. This program involves walking, cycling, scooting or any other active way of getting to or from school, for the whole journey or part of the journey. In class programs, the benefits of being active on the way to and from school will be discussed. Banyule Council is providing us with resources and \$200 for our Breakfast Program. Members of the Sustainable Transport Team will attend assembly on the 13<sup>th</sup> November to help launch the program.

### **Remembrance Day Services and RSL Scholarships**

Each year Watsonia RSL supports our school by offering scholarships to two of our Grade Six students. The scholarships are awarded to students who have displayed excellent leadership skills, demonstrated school values and have been role models for their peers. I am very proud to announce that Bella and Riley, our School Captains, are this year's worthy recipients and congratulate them on behalf of our community. Bella and Riley will represent our school at the Remembrance Day ceremony, at the Watsonia RSL on Saturday, November 11th, at 10.30am. The service will consist of speeches by veterans, followed by our students laying a wreath with other community groups. An award ceremony will then take place followed by light refreshments. Congratulations Bella and Riley!

We have also been invited to attend the Greensborough RSL memorial service at War Memorial Park and our Vice School Captains, Zoe and Lachlan will proudly represent GPS and lay a wreath to honour our service men and women. We know many families attend this local service and if students are dressed in their school uniform, they can walk with Lachie and Zoe to lay the wreath if they wish. I will be at the Watsonia service and School Councillors Kim H. and Michael C. will attend the Greensborough Service.

We will hold our whole school service on Friday 10<sup>th</sup> November at 10.50am. Grades Prep - Six will gather on the netball court, weather permitting, to observe one minute's silence to remember the men and women who have served Australia in all wars and armed conflicts. Representatives of our student leadership group will read the Ode of Remembrance and place a wreath at the base of our flagpole. Family members are welcome to join us.

### **Student Support Groups**

A COMPASS post was sent this week to parents of children who have Student Support Group (SSG) meetings to arrange an appointment for this term. We ask all families who would like a meeting to contact their child's class teacher promptly so we can finalise our SSG schedule.

### World Teachers' Day

Last Friday we had a special morning tea to thank our wonderful Education Support staff and teachers for their work with our students at GPS. Our staff work very hard to optimise our students' academic achievements and overall wellbeing, and we appreciate their efforts. Panel members in our recent School Review commented on the positive relationships that were evident between students and staff and the exemplary teaching practices they observed.



### **Prep transition**

We're looking forward to welcoming our 2024 Preps and their parents/carers to their first transition session next Friday 10<sup>th</sup> November. These sessions provide us with the opportunity to get to know each student and begin to build relationships with our new families. Over the next few weeks, Jill will make contact and visit the kindergartens our future students are currently at, to complete the handover of information to ensure a successful transition from kindergarten to school for our 2024 Preps. Our current Prep students will be taught by our regular CRTs, Emily Zann and Mel MacDonald during transition sessions. Both Emily and Mel are familiar with our students and school programs, so the Prep teaching and learning program will continue without interruption.

A reminder that next Monday is a Curriculum Day and students do not attend school. We wish families a lovely break over the Melbourne Cup Day holiday and look forward to students returning next Wednesday 8<sup>th</sup> November.

I showed this quote to a year 6 student this week and the expression on her face as she read it and understood it was priceless. This student was able to accurately explain what it meant and gave an example. *'I love that quote'* she exclaimed.

Growing up in a large family, public housing, missing out on excursions, sports and school photos, helped me to have empathy and understanding for others. I could have **CHOSEN** to become angry and resentful because we didn't have the same opportunities or experiences of others when growing up. I learnt to appreciate the love, care and sacrifices my parents made, just to clothe and feed us and to make sure we had a roof over our heads.

Others are not so fortunate, yes fortunate. Traumatic or otherwise life events, especially from a young age, can often influence our LIFE CHOICES in how we treat others and what we CHOOSE to do with our lives.

I know many people who have made very positive LIFE CHOICES despite traumatic events in their lives, and others who have made some bad life choices, then managed to change their LIFE CHOICES, which had grown out of resentment and angry, then go on to live very positive lives by making BETTER LIFE CHOICES had more fulfilling friendships and other relationships.



My **HOPE** is that as our young people at Greensborough PS grow and navigate this everchanging world, that they will make **POSITIVE LIFE CHOICES** in their friendships and other areas of their lives. That they will not let any negative **life circumstances/experiences**, stop them from making **positive life choices**.


