Principal's Report

It's hard to believe we have only a few weeks before the end of our school year! We are proud of how well our students have worked this year and applied themselves to improve their academic and wellbeing outcomes. To acknowledge their achievements we have several celebratory events happening in the next few weeks. Our 2024 Preps have their final transition session tomorrow, where they'll meet their Grade Six Buddies and enjoy a special magical performance from the amazing magician, Tim Credible!



Our Grade Six students have their 'Big Day Out' excursion to cap off their primary school years, and Footsteps Dance is coming back on Friday 15th Dec to hold 2 disco sessions for our Junior and Senior students. Margaret has organised the ice-cream truck, which is always an end of year highlight! Class parties and thank-you parties for our Friendship Tree Leaders will be held in the week beginning Monday 11th December and our Kindness Crusaders, Clean Up Crew, Fruit Monitors and Breakfast Club Leaders have been acknowledged at assembly and given icy-pole vouchers as a 'thank-you' for their generous donation of their time to support their peers and our school.

This is an excellent cross-cultural opportunity for our students as well as our visitors, and we're grateful to the parents of several of the students who, as a gesture of gratitude, would like to pay for a lion dance performance at our school assembly. They hope this performance will bring good luck and prosperity to GPS throughout the year. As the Chinese New Year falls on February 10th, they would also like to organise a cultural exchange activity, such as lantern making or making opera masks.

Free Fishing Rods for Grade 5 Students

The Victorian Government has invested \$1.5 million from the Recreational Fishing Licence Trust Fund to provide up to 95,000 Little Angler Kits to Grade 5 children in Victoria.

The free kits provide a wonderful school holiday activity for children with their families and help ease the cost of living, providing a fun activity close to home. As the kits contain hooks and other fishing equipment, ***we are asking parents of Grade 5 students to advise your child's class teacher by Friday 8th December if you wish your child to participate and we will send a kit home.*** Parents can also request to collect their kit from the school themselves if they prefer students not to carry them home. If we have spare kits, we will then offer them to Grade 4 students and so on, until all kits have been distributed.



The kits include a rod, reel with line, tackle tray, some tackle and information on how to use them to catch a fish. Please note that the tackle tray includes fishing hooks. The tackle tray will be wrapped in cardboard and placed inside a pocket inside the fishing kit bag, which will be sealed with a cable tie to discourage students from opening their kits until they are with a parent or carer.

The Victorian Fisheries Authority have created a Little Angler hub on their website. It has useful information, instructional videos and online resources about where and how to fish, linking to existing resources from Fishcare and new resources to be produced just for the Little Angler Kits program.

This initiative aims to grow recreational fishing participation in Victoria by actively encouraging primary school aged children to learn how to fish, as well as learning more about marine life and the natural environment.

Graduation

Our graduates have been heavily involved in preparations for this event, which is a major milestone in their educational and personal journey from primary to secondary schooling. As we near the end of another year most of us are feeling quite tired, yet there are still numerous things on our to do list! It is the same for students after a long year of learning and social engagement.





Commonsense tells me that these birds are native birds related to the Australian honeyeater, and are just protecting their young, which I DO enjoy listening to as they chirp.

GRADE 5 EXCURSIONS

This term the Grade 5s' were lucky enough to experience life at High School by visiting three different Colleges in our local area. Bundoora Secondary College, Greensborough College and Montmorency Secondary College.

Bundoora Secondary College

Our first excursion was to Bundoora Secondary College, we went for 4 weeks. The first week we learnt about soil acidity. We tested the PH levels of the soil and planted some plants that we got to keep, each colour representing the acidity in the soil. Once we had finished we visited the farm animals. Marble the goat bumped into Mr Stephens and nearly knocked his phone out of his hands.



Week two we discovered the world of Coding. We had to connect Micro Bits to the computers to power them up. There were four different options to choose from to add to our design. Detecting noise, a night light, detecting heat and vibrations. The second half of the day we went to Food Tech. We made damper with Lemon Myrtle Spice. It tasted much better hot and when paired with jam.



In week three of the Bundoora experience, we made collages using greyleads to draft it and then to finish them off we used black paint. Some paintings were of characters, food and animals.

Week four was the most enjoyed subject by everyone. We learnt about Forensics. We had to solve a mystery about 'Who Stole the Missing Goat'.

We were given a set of clues in six groups. We had access to microscopes to analyse the hairs of different people, identify soles of shoes by placing them in a box of damp sand, and reveal a message on paper by using different types of pens.



Greensborough College

On the 20th of November we caught the bus to Greensborough College where we were guided around the school in groups to observe and participate in the High School experience.

We participated in Science, P.E., Art and Food Tech.

Science was an experiment of PH testing on a cabbage. We used products like vinegar, water, shampoo, lemon juice and sprite to test its levels.

P.E. was all about fitness activities. We made Christmas ornaments in Art and in Food Tech we made microwave cake in a mug. Overall, everyone enjoyed their day discovering the Greensborough College electives.

Montmorency Secondary College

Our last excursion was on 22nd of November where we were invited to Montmorency Secondary College to watch their annual performance. This year was The Addams Family. We arrived by bus where we had a quick bite to eat before entering the auditorium, listening to eerie music. The stage went dark and the performance began. One of the best parts was when Uncle Fester professed his love for the Moon and then flew by jet pack to visit his one true love. Everyone was amazed at the time and effort that had gone into this performance. It was so much fun to be a part of.



We would like to thank all of these Colleges for allowing us to be a part of their school for a day.



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Grade 3/4 Australian Travel Expo






