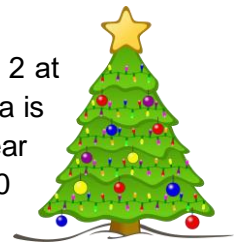
## Students Reports

## Reading Program for 2024 and beyond

Over the coming years Greensborough Primary School are integrating a new and exciting approach to our reading program. This change has come with a movement in education to shift the focus of learning to read from using 'predictable texts' to now using 'decodable texts'. We are using an evidence-based synthetic phonics approach to learning to read. This means that your child will learn phonics skills in a sequential and systematic way. They will learn the 44 sounds in the English language along with the letters that represent those sounds. As they learn new sounds and letters, they will apply this knowledge through reading enjoyable books called 'decodable books'.

Decodable books only contain words that can be read using the skills the children have been taught up to that point. For example, the first set of books the children read is based on only needing to know the sounds for the letters 's a t p i n m d'. Only words using these sounds are used in the books (with the exception of a few 'tricky words' - words that all books need but are hard to sound out at this stage, e.g.: 'the'). For the next set of books, children also learn the sounds for the letters 'g o b h e r f u l'. They continue in this way until all 44 sounds have been learnt, practising their new phonics knowledge as they go. As children progress higher up through the program, they learn different spellings for sounds they have already learnt. Please keep an ear out for students using new language to describe sounds (phonemes) and letters that make the sounds (graphemes).



For students in the Prep to Grade 2 area at G.P.S that have already mastered the 44 sounds and can decode, they will continue to develop other equally important elements of reading which include fluency, vocabulary, and comprehension through text suitable to their age and individual ability. We have purchased many sets of amazing decodable books and made many new resources which we cannot wait to use next year. We look forward with excitement to seeing the students' progress with their reading in 2024 and beyond!

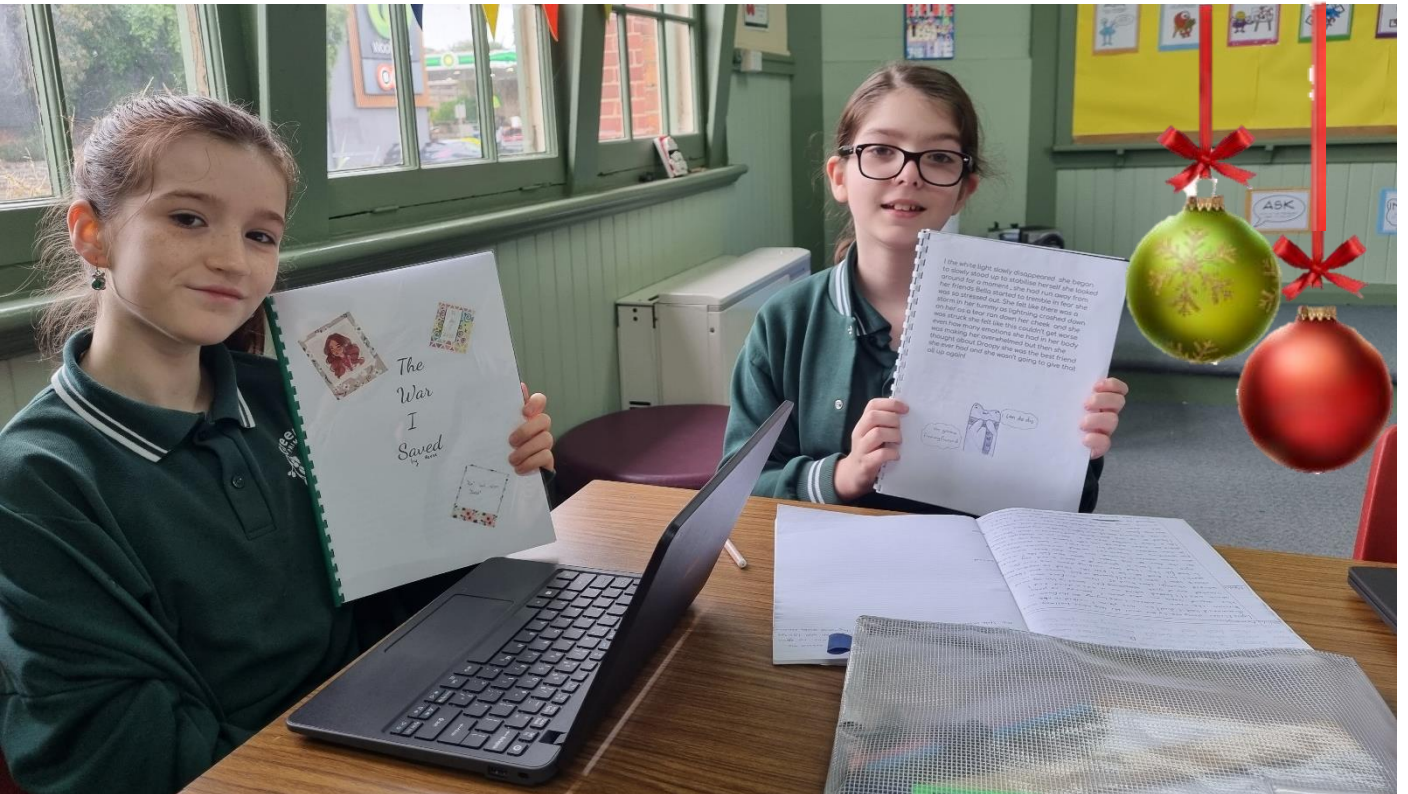


## Victorian High Achievement Programs

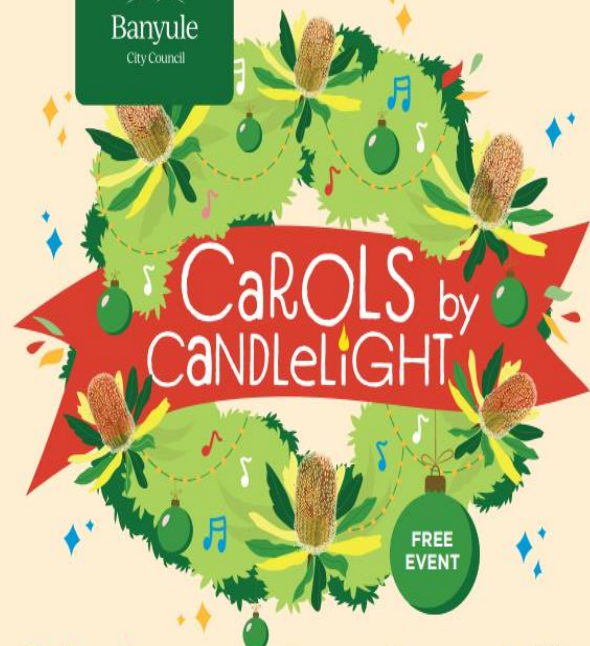
