Division Carnival Swimming Results



Congratulations to Anne -Sophie who competed last week in the Division Swimming Finals. Anne-Sophie came 3rd in Freestyle, with a time of 38 seconds and 4th in Backstroke with a time of 43 seconds. This is a fantastic achievement and we commend Anne-Sophie, not only on her result, but on her excellent sportsmanship and effort.

Staffing

We are currently in the recruiting stage for additional class teaching time in the Prep classroom. The highly successful program in place, that we commenced at the start of the year, is continuing. We have additional Literacy support with Frankie Ciavola, Numeracy support with Assistant Principal Margaret Hirth, and classroom assistance with Educational Support Staff. We hope to finalise the additional teaching appointment before the end of term.

We are pleased to advise that the recruitment process for 5/6A has been finalised and we have an excellent teacher who will take over from Paula while she is on Leave. Jacinta Simpson was the successful candidate and comes highly recommended from her current Principal. Jacinta is an experienced teacher who has taught across several grade levels, including Grade 5/6. Jacinta is excited to join our team at GPS and will spend a half day meeting staff and the grade and planning with Jesse and Paula next week and a half day working in the grade with Paula next term.

We're looking forward to our annual Easter Parade, activities and egg hunt on the last day of term, Thursday 28th March, at 9:10am. Students are practising their activities and are very excited about wearing their special Easter Hats and searching for eggs on the oval. Events such as these make long lasting and powerful memories that stay with children for much of their lives.

The Grade 6 egg toss event is a highlight of the day and our Grade 6 teachers, Paula and Jesse, are keen to challenge the student winners for the overall title! NAPLAN

Congratulations to our Grade Three and Five students who completed NAPLAN this week. The first week of NAPLAN coincided with our Grade 3 - 6 camp which gave us a shorter window to have tests and makeup sessions completed. We thank parents for ensuring students attended each day and our students for working to the best of their ability.

The protocols for NAPLAN testing are very different to the way students normally work in class, as they are unable to ask the teachers for assistance, nor speak to their classmates and the tests have strict time limits. The tests, apart from Grade 3 Writing, were all completed online, and I thank Mr Stephens, our NAPLAN coordinator, for ensuring the tests ran without a hitch. Class teachers had ensured students, especially grade threes, were familiar with the process and that they felt comfortable to complete the tests. NAPLAN provides one set of data for student achievement and teachers also take into consideration students' work samples and other assessments when determining students' level of achievement.
