Brain food: One Hand-held Healthy Snack

A gentle reminder to families that at 10am each day our students eat their 'Brain Food' between the first and second lessons of the day. Children don't actually stop working during this time, rather they eat their snack while listening to teachers introduce the next lesson. *Therefore, we ask parents/carers to pack a snack that students can remove from their lunch box and carry in one hand to the mat or table, rather than bring food that requires spoons or containers to eat*. Footsteps Dance Program Term Three

Planning for next term's programs is well underway and this includes our dance lessons. The ten dance lessons with Footsteps Dance Company are included in our Parent Payments, as is the cost of the bus to Montmorency Secondary College for our performance. *Families who have not paid this year's Parent Payment are required to pay \$50 for the dance program and transport cost.*

The program uses dance as a vehicle to develop students' inter/intrapersonal skills, fitness levels and provide teachers with classroom resources. The program is fun and exciting for students and culminates in a performance for parents.

Student Support Group Meetings

A COMPASS post was sent this week to the parents of students who have Student Support Group meetings (SSGs), asking if they would prefer a Parent/Teacher Interview after reports are sent home or an SSG in the week before. Semester One Reports will be emailed to parents and carers on COMPASS on Friday 21st June. These will be followed by Parent/Teacher Interviews on Wednesday 26th June from 2:10pm – 7:00pm. Information will be sent home via COMPASS in the next fortnight for parents/carers to book a time for their Interviews. If any parents/carers experience difficulty with the COMPASS booking process, please contact the office for assistance. Families with more than one student attending GPS are advised to book early so that you are able to arrange sessions close together, rather than have large time gaps between meetings. So as not to inconvenience families, meetings will need to run on time and adhere to the ten-minute time allowance, therefore if any parents require additional time, a further meeting can be arranged on another date.

Attitudes To School Survey Grades 4 – 6

We value Student Voice as a means to improving student engagement, wellbeing and quality instruction, and over the next fortnight, we are conducting a survey to find out what children in Grades 4 – 6 think of our school. The Attitudes to School Survey is an annual student survey offered by the Department of Education and Training to assist schools in gaining an understanding of students' perceptions and experience of school. Our school will use the survey results to plan programs and activities to improve your child's schooling experience. Further information was sent home to parents of students in Grades 4 – 6 yesterday via COMPASS. Participation in this survey is voluntary and if parents do not wish for their child to do the survey, they will be able to opt out via email to AToSS Coordinator – Jacinta Simpson, Jacinta.simpson2@education.vic.gov.au before the survey begins on Monday 20th May.

2025 Prep Enrolments – Enrol by Friday 26th 28 July 2024

If any families know anyone who is coming to Greensborough Primary next year, please encourage them to register their details as soon as possible, (this includes siblings of current students). Under the new DET guidelines all 2025 Prep enrolments should be completed by 26 July 2024. We have already had a number of enquiries and school tours for places in 2025 and the sooner we get a sense of our intake for next year, the sooner we can start planning for grade structures.

Parents/Carers will be notified of the outcome of the application between Monday 29 July and Friday 9 August 2024. If an enrolment offer is sent, it should be accepted by Friday 23 August 2024.

DET Information to Families about School Saving Bonus

Dear parents and carers,

You may have seen the recent announcement of the School Saving Bonus, as part of the Victorian Budget 2024/25. We are sharing more information about how families will be able to access and use this support.

This one-off support will include \$400 for each eligible student to help families cover the costs of school uniforms and activities in 2025.

It will be available to parents and carers of every child enrolled in a Victorian government school in 2025.

Cash will not be paid directly to individuals or families. Instead, families will receive the bonus as credits on their school accounts that will help meet the costs of your children's activities and uniforms.

Existing supports

The School Saving Bonus support will be in addition to existing and continuing means-tested supports for camps, sports, excursions and uniforms.

The application-based Affordable School Uniform program, through State Schools' Relief, will continue to be available to families experiencing financial hardship or other forms of vulnerability and short-term crisis. This program allows schools to make multiple applications for support on parents' behalf throughout the year if needed.

There will be more information and guidance about the School Saving Bonus in Term 3, 2024, ahead of its implementation in 2025.

Emergency Clothing Payment

At times, we supply students with dry clothing items to replace their own clothing which may have become wet or muddy. A reminder that if your child is supplied with these items, we greatly appreciate a gold coin donation to ensure we can keep a supply of varied sizes for future use. Items such as shorts and trousers can be washed and returned, however socks and underwear cannot be returned and parents may keep the items.

Victorian Premiers' Reading Challenge

Every year at Greensborough Primary School, we strongly encourage and fully support all of our students to participate in the Premiers' Reading Challenge. Each and every book that a child reads continues to build their knowledge, wonderment, fluency in reading, vocabulary and comprehension.

Since the challenge began 20 years ago, Victorian children have read more that 45 million books- that is enough to fill nearly 11 Olympic sized swimming pools. This year children across Victoria will read another 4 million books.

We are excited and optimistic that our students at G.P.S could read a record number of books during the 2024 challenge. **In the coming weeks**, letters will be sent home to families that will provide further information regarding the Premiers' Reading Challenge. These letters will also contain a free bookmark plus login details.

In 2023 59 students completed the challenge which was a remarkable achievement. Students were presented with a certificate at our end of year assembly and has a special 'Fish and Chip lunch' in Term Four.

We are expecting that this year's Premiers' Reading Challenge will be bigger than ever!

Grade 1/2 students were looking at what materials are suitable in different weather conditions, including rain. They had to work together to design, build and test a 'rain proof' house. Students placed a LEGO person inside to see if he



was dry or wet after a 'sprinkle' from the watering can.

Grade 3/4 students were looking at different natural disasters and how some parts of Australia have to build houses with these factors in mind. Students needed to build a house that was either tall



enough to survive the 10cm 'flood' or buoyant enough not to sink in the flood. Students had fun testing out and evaluating the different successors and what changes they could make.

Grade 5/6 students experimenting with designing and creating different foundations and structures that would be seismic (earthquake) proof. Students had fun working as team to share ideas and testing their creations out using a jelly tub to represent the earthquake levels on the Richter scale.
