



Northern Star Chess has been running chess tournaments in Victoria for many years! Ivanhoe Primary School has hosted events in the past, and this year the school will be hosting a tournament in August. We welcome IPS students to join in!

Online registration is essential, we offer this using Trybooking. Please see below for the link which has been set up especially for IPS parents.

> Date: Thursday 22nd August Time: 9:30am – 2:00 pm Cost: \$25 per player (plus \$0.50 booking fee per ticket)

Register before the event

Due to the nature of this process, your child needs to be registered online before the event. We can only accept IPS students on the day if they are registered. (unless a parent comes with the child at the start of the tournament to give permission and make a cash payment)

Attending the tournament

- · Students should attend their classroom a the start of the day as usual, so they can be marked off the roll.
- Sometime before 9:30am, they can come to the playing hall. Organisers will follow up on any registered
 players who have not showed up at the venue.
- IPS students should bring their snacks, lunch and a drink with them. It is fine to bring all this in their school bag.
- All players play 7 games of chess during the day. We aim to finish games and presentation around 2pm 2:15pm.
- · After the event, they can go back to their class.

Format:

- Individual based tournament
- Every student plays 7 games against players of similar skill, regardless of how many games they win or lose (Swiss pairing method)
- Students experience proper tournament rules
- Gold/Silver/Bronze medals awarded to various grade/year level categories
- "Star of the tournament" trophy for top scorer of the day
- Table prizes/giveaways.
- Cost is \$25 per student per event
