Principal's Report

A huge thankyou to all the families who helped us celebrate Book Week by supporting our students to dress in their favourite book characters or attending the parade yesterday. Book Week is one of the highlights of our year and the enjoyment of the children's faces was priceless as they guessed their classmates' and teachers' characters and admired their costumes. Each year we're impressed with the creativity and imaginative efforts showcased during the parade and this year was no exception! It was pleasing to see our



senior students lead by example and join in the fun of dressing up for their final book parade in their primary school years.

The Book Fair has attracted a great deal of interest and students have clearly enjoyed perusing the selection of books and stationery on sale and purchasing their favourite books. It's been a pleasure to see the excited faces of students as they escort their parents into the Library and leave with their carefully chosen treasures. This is a major fundraiser for the Library and all funds raised are channelled back into purchasing new books. The Book Fair is open every day this week before and after school. Sincere thanks to our Library Teacher Frankie and Library Assistant Sarah for their organization and efforts to ensure Book Week activities were highly engaging and ran smoothly.

In the weeks leading up to Book Week, all grades have a focus on poetry during their Literacy lessons, studying and writing different poetic styles, including haiku, cinquain, diamond, rhyming, etc. I've greatly enjoyed reading students' poems and been amazed at their ability to articulate their thoughts or create a visual image through their poems. Our Poetry Unit culminates with students in each grade having the very difficult task of voting for their favourite poem authored by their classmates. The top four poems are then shortlisted for each grade and displayed in the foyer, and staff have the difficult task of voting for the best in each grade. Hi Everyone,

On Tuesday evening this week Hubby and I were able to attend the live performance 'ANH DO, THE HAPPIEST REFUGEE' live performance at the Athenaeum Theatre. This was thanks to my daughter and her new Hubby who had come down with COVID and couldn't go so they gifted us their tickets!! Better still the experience gave me the topic for this week's newsletter and fits in well with BOOK WEEK!



It was **FANTASTIC!** It was based on his book 'The Happiest Refugee'. Through comedy, film clips and photos, Anh went through the real-life story of his family's journey from making their escape from the war in Vietnam to their life in Australia. There was a mix of emotions, laughter and tears from Anh as he spoke. Here is just a snapshot of the evening.











It was a story of perseverance and resilience, of humbleness, love and caring. Anh and his siblings (a sister was born in Australia) were always encouraged to be kind and to not fear failure and to keep trying. In Grade One Anh's Mum was told that Anh was a slow learner and needed to go to a different type of school. Instead, his Mum bought him books from an Op Shop again and again – the result? Anh grew to become the Dux of his year 12 year and ended up with an ATR of 98% He studied to be a lawyer before discovering comedy. He kept his promise to buy his Mum a house when he had enough money! He then rediscovered his childhood love of portrait drawing and won an Archibald prize for his painting of Indigenous songwriter and singer, Archie Roach. Anh then rekindled his love of writing. Many children enjoy his humorous stories! His son, Xavier recently won an Archibald prize for his self-portrait.







Anh's brother, Khoa Do, became 'YOUNG AUSTRALIAN OF THE YEAR' in 2005 for his filmmaking and his community work with homeless youth. As an 18-month-old baby on a refugee boat, Thai pirates tried to throw him into the ocean!

There were also sad stories of his father's PSTD and the affect it had on the family, especially his mother who struggled to provide for her family while also teaching her children TO BE KIND TO EVERYONE AND TO NOT FEAR FAILURE BUT KEEP STRIVING!

SO, THIS BOOK WEEK, LET'S ENCOURAGE OUR CHILDREN AND YOUNG PEOPLE TO READ. THERE ARE SO MANY STORIES OF RESILIENCE, PERSEVERANCE, KINDNESS, CARING, FRIENDSHIP, COURAGE, OUT THERE TO INSPIRE THEM. PERHAPS READ A STORY SUCH AS 'THE HAPPIEST REFUGEE' WITH YOUR CHILDREN AND HAVE A FAMILY DISCUSSION ABOUT WHAT THEY CAN LEARN FROM ANH'S EXPERIENCES.



GRADE 1/2 SPOTLIGHT








In 1/2, we have been working on our story writing. We have started by creating our main characters and our story setting. We are so excited to start the writing process next week!


