Principal's Report

We are very pleased to welcome our new Grade 5/6 class teacher, Clara Ellis, to Greensborough Primary. Clara is an experienced teacher who impressed the interview panel with her knowledge and passion for teaching. Both our new Prep Teacher, Talina and Clara will attend GPS for a full day of planning for 2025 class programs, with teachers in their teams in the coming weeks. Clara will also meet with her new grade on December 10th when all students meet their 2025 class, Magic Maths and Spelling Mastery teachers. Over the coming weeks current class teachers are meeting with students' 2025 class teachers to give a thorough handover of student information to ensure a successful transition into their new grades. Talina will meet our 2025 Preps at our Prep transition sessions for the next four Fridays. While many schools are experiencing staff shortages and finding it difficult to fill vacancies, we feel very fortunate to have new staff members who are highly recommended and experienced, and an excellent 'fit' for our community.

Remembrance Day

Staff were impressed with our students as they commemorated Remembrance Day on Monday. Our Vice School Captains did an excellent job, conducting our service on the netball court and our Prep – 6 students listened respectfully as they heard why Remembrance Day was so important. Our House Captains and Vice Captains proudly represented our school and laid a wreath at the Greensborough Service at War Memorial Park, whilst our School Captains attended the service at Watsonia RSL. Veterans at both services commented on their pleasure at seeing school children participating in the services and honouring all those who have served in peace keeping missions and armed conflicts.

Congratulations to our School Captains Xavier, Maisie and Charlotte who received an award from Watsonia RSL recognising their leadership and embodiment of school values. Our School Captains are worthy recipients, and we know they'll carry these traits with them to secondary school.

Monday was **REMEMBRANCE DAY**, as we remembered the end to fighting in World War I. Sadly, **PEACE** did not last, and the world has and is experiencing conflict.

We have created many symbols of **PEACE**, as we endeavour to achieve it:

Doves are widely appreciated for their **PEACE**fulness and gentleness as they can soothe and restore wellbeing. The dove is considered a symbol for **PEACE**, purity, hope, renewal, transformation and new beginnings which makes it a gentle yet powerful image for over 2000 years! Dove



performances have also taken place at the opening ceremonies of the Olympic Games, which is also known as a 'Festival of **PEACE**'.



Teaching kids about PEACE isn't just talking about war and conflict. PEACE is talking about kindness, fairness, inner peace, respect for the environment, conflict resolution and so much more.

PEACE is a very broad and quite complicated term. It varies from person to person and is often influenced by where we live, how we live and the way we see events happening around us. What we mean by **PEACE** can also change depending on whether we are referring to our lives at home, at school, in the community or **PEACE** in the world (global **PEACE**). Thinking of **PEACE** at different levels, here are some examples of what it may mean:

- At home: everyone in the family feeling safe, getting on with one another and being healthy and happy
- At school: feeling safe and happy and being able to learn and develop
- In your community: people getting on, and there not being divisions between people because of who they are or where they live. People helping one another, welcoming people and doing things together.
- Globally: All humans being treated equally no matter what is their race, religion or background; everyone having enough to eat, health care and education; no conflicts or wars.

So, as I like to say, let's continue to work together to help our children and young people to be the best they can be, remembering that **PEACE** has its beginnings in the **hearts** and **minds** of us all!
