Students' Reports and 2025 Grades

Thank you to staff who have spent many hours this term writing student reports. This process involves triangulating and analysing student achievement data to write reports that accurately reflect students' achievements and their areas for future learning. Data collections include results from formal assessments, class work and teacher observations. Teachers collaborate to moderate the data and ensure their professional judgements about student achievement are aligned.

Student reports will be sent home via COMPASS on Friday 13th December. Parents who would like a hard copy of student reports, should contact your child's class teacher. Parents and Carers are reminded to save student reports from COMPASS on to your computer hard drive, so that you will always have access to them.

The class your child will be in next year will be sent home Friday 6th December and on Tuesday 10th December students will spend the morning getting to know their new 2025 teacher and classmates. After recess students will also spend time with their 2025 Spelling Mastery and Magic Maths classes and teachers, before returning to their 2025 class groups.

Students in Grades One to Six, new to the school in 2025 have been attending transition sessions and have begun building relationships with their peers, and will also attend the 'Meet your 2025 Teacher and Class session.

Our new Grade 5/6 teacher, Clara Ellis, will spend this day at GPS and is looking forward to meeting her new class!

Our graduates have been heavily involved in preparations for this event, which is a major milestone in their educational and personal journey from primary to secondary schooling. STUDENT WELLBEING

Hi Everyone,

Gratitude is healthy for us. Dr. Robert A. Emmons of the University of California, Davis, reveals that cultivating gratitude can increase happiness levels by around 25 percent. Other studies have shown that kids who practise grateful thinking have more positive attitudes toward school and family.

Today, November 28th is THANKSGIVING DAY - an international celebration, celebrated in the USA, Canada, Grenada, the Philippines, Saint Lucia, Liberia and the Netherlands. It began as a day where people took the opportunity of giving thanks for the blessing of the harvest and of the preceding year. In the US, the celebration is often recognised as an event that took place when English colonists held a feast to thank Native Americans for helping them start new lives in the US. 'The First Thanksgiving' was celebrated after their first harvest in October 1621. The feast lasted three days.

An attitude of gratefulness every day is great for our mental health. So how can we help our kids learn to live gratefully? Gratitude can begin at home, and here are 8 tips to help you start growing an attitude of gratitude in your own household:

1. Name your blessings.

Have a moment of thanks each day when everyone shares something they're thankful for.

2. Be a grateful parent.

What an invaluable exercise it is to tell our kids why we're grateful to have them! It goes without saying that we love our kids, and that we're thankful beyond words for their love, their smiles, their hugs and so much more. When we tell them what makes them special to us, their self-esteem is boosted for the right reasons.

3. Have them pitch in when they want something.

If your kids get pocket money or earn money for chores, have them participate in buying some of the things they want. When kids themselves take the time to save up, they gain an understanding of the value of things and encourages kids to appreciate what they have.

- 4. Set a good example by saying 'thank you' sincerely and often. The values our kids embrace as they get older are the ones they see us living out. When our kids see us expressing sincere thanks all the time, they'll be more inclined to do so as well.
- 5. Encourage them to give back.

The old saying 'it's better to give than to receive' helps us realise that it does feel great to help someone else out. When kids give their time and energy to help others, they're less likely to take things like health, home and family for granted.

- 6. Insist on politeness and respect all around. When we teach our children to treat others with dignity and respect, they'll be less likely to take assistance and kindness for granted, and more likely to give it the value it deserves.
- Look for teachable moments.
 When kids can connect the concept of gratitude to a real-life situation, the lesson we're teaching will be much more likely to stick.
- 8. Find the silver lining.

When kids complain it can be helpful to find a response that looks on the bright(er) side. It's called an "attitude of gratitude"; it teaches our kids to be resilient and refocus them on the positives they may be overlooking.

I am grateful to be able to serve you and your children!

Recently I have been asked to speak with students who are experiencing big emotions and are feeling overwhelmed. All students have had a big year and a number of weeks of assessments over recent weeks, and, like all of us, are becoming very tired as we reach the end of the school year. Please encourage your children to have device free evenings and more sleep so they can enjoy the fun filled last weeks that are planned by the hard-working staff.
