Principal's Report

It was terrific to welcome not only our own students back after the term break, but also a group of short-term international students from Taiwan and China. The students stay for periods of 1-4 weeks and are spread from Prep – Grade 6, which means all our students have a chance to enjoy and learn from the cross-cultural exchange. Once again, it's pleasing to see how inclusive our GPS students are, as they welcome our visitors and invite them to join games during the breaks or work collaboratively during class sessions.

Our students have settled in well to class programs and routines after the break and we're looking forward to building on the outcomes students achieved in Semester One, through our highly differentiated class programs, intervention and extension programs. With tutoring, oral language, English as an Additional Language, High Achievers' Programs, GATEWAYS, Maths Olympiad, Corrective Reading and other small group or 1:1 supports, we ensure all students' learning programs are aimed at their point of need.

Extra-Curricular Programs

As well as our regular class and specialist programs, we continue to offer a wide range of extra-curricular programs this term. Whilst we have a strong focus on academic achievement, we know students have passions and interests in a variety of areas and I'd like to thank staff for their commitment to offer engaging activities and programs that go beyond the standard curriculum.

We started the term celebrating **NAIDOC Week** with this year's theme: "The Next Generation: Strength, Vision & Legacy," celebrating not only the achievements of the past but the bright future ahead. To enhance the celebration and raise awareness of the week's importance, each student was given a ball in the colours of the aboriginal flag, which have specific symbolic meanings.





Next Tuesday our Prep students will celebrate their '100 days Of School'. This is a great milestone in their school life and Emily has planned a fun-filled day, completing tasks related to 100. We're looking forward to seeing students arrive dressed as if they were centenarians! Our Librarian, Bec, has planning for Book Week Parade, Muti-Age Day and Book Fair well underway, and I know many families and staff members have already started planning their outfits. Our Poetry Competition coincides with Book Week and we're looking forward to reading student entries.

Our Grade 3-6 students are honing their **Athletics** skills in preparation for the trials for District Athletics Carnival and PE teacher Leo, has also secured another Sports in School Grant and is liaising with external providers for **Hockey** sessions. Our STEM teacher Leah has planned a **Science Incursion and Mult-Age Day, Cosmic Chemistry,** in the last week of term to celebrate Science Week. Several **Incursions and Excursions** have been planned, including 'History of Toys' Incursion for P-2 and our Grade Twos have their annual **Sleepover** which is always a highlight of their school journey.

As well as yard duty, teachers are also rostered for extracurricular programs and clubs during lunch breaks. We have two teams of Grade 5/6 students entered into **Tournament of the Minds** and class teacher, Jesse, will work with students two lunchtimes per week. We also have **Recorder, Gardening** and **Sports Clubs, Friendship Tree activities, Chill Out Zone,** as well as the return of **Choir** and the **Library open** for lunchtime enjoyment.

External providers also offer **Tennis and Coding Lessons** during lunch breaks and **Instrumental Music and Singing Lessons** are timetabled during class times. If any parents would like further information about these external providers and programs, please contact the office.



Circus Skills begin this Friday and continue for six fun-filled sessions, culminating in a concert at Montmorency Secondary College on Tuesday 2nd September. Kindness Crusaders: Waste Wise Wednesdays

Student Voice and Agency are very important to us at GPS and class teachers are very pleased to support an initiative from our Kindness Crusaders: Phillippa, Myla, Harriet, Indie and Lilyana. Our KCs outlined their ideas to reinstate **Waste Wise Wednesdays**, designed to minimise waste and encourage sustainable practices. The outcome is that **Waste Wise Wednesdays** will resume next Wed 30th July, and we ask students to come with a zero-waste lunch that contains no throw away packaging, instead all food is packed in re-usable containers.

The KCs will monitor student lunchboxes each Wednesday and record the number of students who have a waste wise lunchbox. The number of students who have participated within the class will be converted into a



percentage and recorded on a whole school chart. The class with the highest percentage of participation will earn a certificate for the week and after 3 wins, students will be rewarded with a cookie or icy-pole from JSC on Friday. 

- 1. Resilience poster: listing/drawing all the ways in which you, both individually and as a family, have coped at difficult times – activities, communication, ways of reaching out, etc... For example: this can be useful for children who have faced friendship issues, as we all have experienced! How did they get through it? What worked? Do they have a growing understanding of themselves and others? Do they recognise how emotions play a big role? Do they have a growing sense of their own self-worth?
- 2. Gratitude poster: Each person lists/draws what they are thankful for.

Very soon you and your children should discover your inner strength and how amazing you are!
