## **Principal's Report**

At the halfway point of Term Three, while staff are planning, and students are engaging in a vast array of activities and experiences, we are also putting in place plans for Term Four and, indeed, for 2026.

Book Week, Circus Skills, Athletics, Fathers' Day, Maths Olympiad, History, the Grade Two Sleepover and Science Week will be the focus for the balance of Term Three.

Term Four has Swimming, the Prep / Grade One breakfast and Transition Programs across the school from new Preps preparing to arrive at school to our Grade Six students graduating and, along with this, much anticipated activities such as the annual ice-cream truck visit.



The amount of careful planning and thought that goes into all of the above cannot be underestimated and our staff should be commended for going above and beyond as they always do. The other unsung hero in all of this is Mehgan who, for every school activity, has to ensure that all financial payments in and out are rigorously receipted and accounted for. Thank you, Mehgan!

Planning for 2026 is also now well underway with potential school staffing models being evaluated, students requiring both additional support and extension being identified and budgets to support all of this being developed.

At last week's School Council meeting, the 2026 Parent Payment schedule was approved. Whilst this won't be distributed to the school community until the first week of Term Four, the main change is that next year, rather than parents having to individually contact MAXIM to order their children's 2026 resources, we have included the Book Pack items in the Parent Payment schedule. The reason for this is that, whilst it was a relatively straightforward process for parents to order their children's packs, it definitely caused angst for some families. It was also not always ideal for some students when their resources arrived after other students because of differences in the dates that orders had been placed. All student resources will be delivered to the school in the last week of Term Four and class teachers will be able to have all resources ready for all students for the start of the 2026 year.

It would be very much appreciated if any final 2025 Parent Payment contributions could be paid by the end of this term, so Mehgan is able to focus on the 2026 payments during Term Four.

The Justice Department has restarted its Corrections Crew program which was paused during the COVID lockdowns. Every four weeks on a Saturday morning, a crew undertakes maintenance tasks in the school grounds. This Saturday, soft fall mulch will be spread under all of the playgrounds to ensure they are safe and meet compliance guidelines. We are eagerly awaiting the addition of a new piece of playground equipment which we are hopeful will be installed before the end of the school year. This equipment is being paid for by Parents and Friends, Junior School Council and a donation from the Internation Students and the agency that coordinates these cultural visits. The oval and all grass areas are being mowed this week after being dormant for many months and we are looking forward to having this done. Leo has ordered new soccer nets which will be another great play addition.

Whilst it is only a relatively short term (just nine weeks), a lot of active learning is taking place, so we hope everyone is able to stay rested and fresh to fully engage and enjoy everything that the balance of the term has to bring.


