
Challenge certificates will be presented to students during assembly in Term Four and students will also be rewarded with a special Fish and Chip lunch in Term Four also.

The students wowed the audience with their energy and enthusiasm, and the show was filled with vibrant colours, laughter, and lots of audience participation.


We were fortunate to have the Circus Crew working.
