This is a terrific suite of programs catering to different students' interests and needs, and **we are proud staff and parents are working hard for our students** and ensuring we are delivering programs that build academic, engagement and wellbeing outcomes.

Once again we commend our students for their commitment to achieve their learning goals this term and congratulate them on their results. Visitors to the Grades 3/4 and 1/2 Discovery Expos this fortnight have been high in their praise of the students' knowledge and confidence when presenting their projects. Their excitement and engagement with their work was very evident and we all came away with some new and interesting facts about ancient civilizations and inventions.

#### Planning for rest of 2025 and 2026

We are well and truly entrenched in planning for 2026 and at the same time still extremely busy planning for the remainder of 2025. We are basing planning on all the information we currently have.

<u>Staffing:</u> Several staff are taking leave in Term Four and we are very fortunate that our regular CRTs who know our students and programs well are able to continue the Teaching and Learning programs. STEM will be taught by Erin when Leah takes long service leave and Librarian Bec and ES Sarah will be completing

course placements next term and Mel will teach the Library program and existing ES staff will cover Sarah's programs.

We are very pleased to welcome back Paula Ly, who has returned from her overseas trip and is keen to work at GPS in Term Four and continue the excellent relationships she's built with students, staff and parents. For parents new to GPS, Paula is one of our highly regarded ongoing teachers who has been on Leave this year. Paula will work almost full-time next term as she replaces staff who are released for curriculum coordination and IEP writing, as well as teaching three Literacy Extension classes each week and replacing staff who have reduced their time fractions. Paula visited classes earlier this week and both students and staff were highly excited to welcome her back.

#### 2026 Grade Planning- Parent Requests

Behind the scenes we are busy planning for 2026 with all the information we currently know! Early next term, teachers will ask students to nominate friendship groups so we can begin the process of allocating students to their 2026 grades. This process includes teachers' consideration of students' friendship groups, school data on academic abilities and needs, and parent input on specific requests for their children.

We will be finalising grades and staffing by the end of October, so we can begin handover of student information from this year's teacher to next. Therefore, if parents or caregivers have any specific requests for next year, it's very important that you send in your requests via email, phone, handwritten note or in person, to Margaret or myself by Friday October 17th and this can be factored into decision making. We do not have the capacity to change placements once grades are finalised. Students will meet their 2026 teachers and spend the morning with them on Tuesday 9th December.

Term 3 has really flown and has been full of special activities at GPS which I hope will become special memories for the students.






Tuesday was extremely windy with the wind blowing in many directions as it swirled. It got me thinking about the many influences that swirl around our lives and the lives of our children and young people – some for good and others, sadly, with adverse outcomes. Some of these influences are family, siblings, peers, teachers, coaches, other significant adults, social media (including Tik Tok, You tube, influencers, Instagram, chat rooms such as Discord), gaming, films, books, scams, etc... Sadly, I see and hear social media use influencing the words and actions of younger and younger children, often in adverse ways.

As we grow we seek our 'own tribe' as we try to find where we fit or don't fit. We make choices, sometimes good ones and sometimes choices that result in serious outcomes.

I like to encourage

students to have a **DREAM/GOAL** and to look at what they need to do to achieve it and what they need to be wary of as we look at **CROSSROADS AND FORKS IN THE ROAD**.

Another analogy is **A CAR** – what does a car need to go? We need to put the right fuel in the engine. We need to steer the car in the right direction to reach our destination. There are rules to follow to keep ourselves and others safe, etc...



Analogies are great to help guide our young people and to help them to think through situations. When my children were growing up, we also sometimes discussed how what we see and listen to affects our mind/our thoughts – THOUGHTS → FEELINGS/BELIEFS → BEHAVIOUR/ACTIONS.



As parents, we can be the greatest influence on our children. Of course this involves lots of warmth, calmness, two-way discussions and boundaries. In today's society it is becoming increasing difficult with so many things encroaching on precious family time.
