Principal's Report

Lizzie and Lachie also represented our school proudly as they laid a wreath on behalf of our school community during the Remembrance Day Service at the RSL. We wish Lachie and Lizzie all the best as they continue their leadership journey at secondary school.

Whilst our school Vice Captains and House Captains were disappointed they were unable to attend the Greensborough RSL service at War Memorial Park as it was cancelled due to the terrible weather conditions; we were pleased that there was a break in the weather so that we could hold our school service outside. We congratulate our students in Grade Six who led the service and all students who respectfully honoured armed forces members who have died in wars, conflicts and peace-keeping operations.



What a fantastic time was had by everyone during our Halloween celebrations. We were bedazzled by costumes during the parade and the 'trick or treating' was greatly enjoyed by everyone. The disco was a huge success and it was wonderful to see students and staff having a joyous time dancing to the tunes carefully selected by the DJ. This event was certainly a highlight of our school year to date, and our students and community have resoundingly requested this be an annual event added to our calendar. 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Free public transport

From 1 January 2026, people aged under 18 can travel free on all Victorian public transport services using a new youth myki card. This includes trams, trains, buses and coach services. To access free travel, students must tap the myki card on and off each time they travel. For areas that do not use myki cards, they must show their myki card to travel free.

2026 School Camp Weekaway

We are looking forward to our **2026 Grades 3 – 6 School Camp** at **Camp Weekaway** in the beautiful Benloch Valley near Lancefield. To assist families in planning ahead, we have outlined the key dates and payment schedule below.

The **first instalment of \$150** (50% of the total camp cost including the \$50 deposit) is **due by Friday, 5th December 2025**. Please note that **medical and dietary information forms are also due by Friday, 5th December 2025**.



Next year, there will be a further two instalments:

- **Second instalment of \$100 – due Friday, 27th February 2026**
- **Third and final instalment of \$100 – due Friday, 27th March 2026**

This brings the total camp cost to **\$400**.

These payments have been **staggered to assist families** in managing costs in the lead-up to camp. However, families are **welcome to pay in full** at any time or to **contact the school** if they wish to discuss **alternative financial arrangements**.

World Kindness Day is an international observance on 13th November each year. It was introduced in 1998 by the World Kindness Movement, a coalition of nations' Kindness NGOs (Non-Government Organisations). It is observed in many countries, including Canada, Australia, Nigeria and the United Arab Emirates. Singapore observed the day for the first time in 2009. Italy and India also observed the day. In the UK, it is fronted by David Jamilly, who co-founded Kindness Day UK with Louise Burfitt-Dons.

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Construction Blitz on Grimshaw Street – Spring/Summer 2025



M80 RING ROAD

Works Notification
October 2025

We're building the new Grimshaw Street Interchange in Greensborough, with express lanes to the North East Link and less congestion for locals.

Major works on Grimshaw Street continues in November and December. Grimshaw Street will close in both directions between Frye Street and Greensborough Bypass, with crews working 24/7 to build the west side of the interchange.

While major works continue at the Grimshaw Street Interchange, crews will also be working nearby in Kempston Street. In late October and November, beams will be delivered and installed for the new Kempston Street bridge, requiring overnight road closures of Kempston Street.

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Kempston Street bridge beam installation

Kempston Street closed in both directions between Sellars Street and Hamlet Street, and Greensborough Bypass – northbound and southbound closures at times.	Tuesday 28 October to Thursday 30 October, 10pm to 5am each night Sunday 9 November to Friday 14 November, 10pm to 5am each night	Detour via Greensborough Bypass, Diamond Creek Road and Yando Street. Delays of up to 5 minutes.
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Public transport bus service changes



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What we'll be doing

As part of these upgrades, a works area will be set up on Grimshaw Street, between Frye Street and the Greensborough Bypass. Activities in this area will include:

- placing traffic barriers, fencing and lighting to establish temporary works areas
- cutting into asphalt and concrete on roads and paths
- demolition, excavation and drilling works
- installing large concrete beams on Kempston Street bridge overnight with road closures in place
- installing of concrete culverts
- piling and pouring concrete to build new road bridge foundations and retaining walls
- installing and connecting new drainage, smart transport systems, traffic signals, lighting and other utilities
- laying asphalt, line marking, and concrete to reinstate road and paths

What to expect

As we conduct these works you may notice:

- varying levels of noise, light, dust and intermittent vibration during work hours
- materials and equipment deliveries to and from works areas, including out-of-hours via local roads
- AK Lines Reserve site compound operations, including construction traffic access
- changed traffic conditions on Grimshaw Street, on local roads and footpaths
- detours of bus routes 566 and 902
