Bill was a greatly valued mentor who generously gave his time, expertise and positive outlook to students and GPS for over 16 years. He always had a smile and a twinkle in his eyes and the positive impact of his mentorship on students was enormous. Bill will be warmly remembered and sadly missed by our students and staff, and our thoughts are with his wife Chris and his family.

## CSEF increased to \$400!

Pleasingly, from 1 January 2026, families eligible for Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund will see an increase in support to \$400 for primary and secondary school children, up from \$154 and \$256 respectively. This is excellent news for families and CSEF can be used for 2026 camp costs for Grade 3 – 6 students. All students can use the funds to pay for swimming, excursions and ISS buses. We ask families who are eligible for CSEF to contact Mehgan our Business Manager. Mehgan will also send an application home to families who currently receive CSEF as well as families knew to the school.

*We are still in the process of the VSBA Makesafe team gradually restoring power and services disrupted by the power outage on the first day of school. 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# Specialist SPOTLIGHT

Specialist Spotlight highlights the learning our students engage in beyond the classroom, including Physical Education, Library, STEM, Mandarin and Art. These specialist subjects enrich classroom learning and support creativity, movement, curiosity, language and a love of learning.

## What's In Store for PE This Year?

This year in Physical Education, students will build skills, confidence, and teamwork across a wide range of sports and activities. Term 1 focuses on Basketball and Cricket, linking closely with our summer Interschool Sports (ISS) program. During this term, we also host visiting sport providers such as gymnastics and AFL, sometimes with special guests, to encourage students to try new sports and stay active. Swim trials also take place in Term 1.

In Term 2, students participate in Cross Country, followed by Athletics in Term 3, where all students have the opportunity to trial for events. Selected students will represent the school at various sporting venues, representing GPS and competing against other schools.

In Term 4, all students take part in a swimming program at WaterMarc, developing essential water safety and swimming skills so they can confidently and safely enjoy water-based activities for life.



## LIBRARY

**Teacher: Ms Rebecca Gauci**

This term in Library, the Preps will be exploring the library, browsing and borrowing books, and sharing how the stories make them feel. Students in 1/2A and 1/2B will be discovering different types of books, finding where they belong on the shelves, and connecting story characters to their own experiences. The Year 3/4 Students will be investigating how books are organised, identifying their intended audience, and analysing how characters make stories engaging. Year 5/6 students will be comparing senior picture books by Shaun Tan, interpreting the images, and discussing their ideas about the stories.



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# BUDDIES

Each week, our Foundation students spend special time with their Grade 6 buddies, working together on a shared activity. These sessions may include reading, games, art tasks or simple classroom projects, all designed to encourage teamwork and connection.

The buddy program provides wonderful benefits for both age groups. Our Foundation students build confidence, develop social skills and feel supported as they learn from positive senior role models. Having a familiar Grade 6 friend around the school also helps our youngest students feel safe and settled.

For our Grade 6 students, the program fosters leadership, responsibility and empathy. They learn how to guide, encourage and communicate with younger peers in a caring and respectful way.

It is always heartwarming to see the genuine friendships that form, strengthening our sense of community and belonging across the school.



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## Teacher: Mrs Leah Ryan

This term in STEM, students across all year levels will be exploring exciting learning experiences linked to Earth and Space Sciences. Our Prep students will become familiar with STEM routines and structures while learning about the weather. Year 1 and 2 students will investigate Earth's resources, with a focus on how we can reduce, reuse and recycle to better care for our planet.

Students in Years 3 and 4 will explore water as a vital Earth resource, learning about freshwater sources and the water cycle. Years 5 and 6 students will delve into Earth's gravity, the planets in our solar system, and extreme weather events.

Across Years 3–6, students will also learn about how these topics have impacted the lives of Indigenous Australians. To conclude the term, students will either begin or continue to develop their coding skills, with this learning connected to Harmony Day later in the term.



## Teacher: Mr Han Hung

Ni hao (that's hello in Mandarin)! It is going to be a fantastic first term in Mandarin. We are very excited to be starting our Mandarin program. Primary years are important years to be immersed in another language and culture; we look forward to learning about all things Chinese this year through the use of mini games, song and dance. For our Year 3/4 students, we will be learning about days of the week. We will also be learning the various celebrations of Chinese New Year, such as lion dancing, dragon dancing, also the location of these activities in Melbourne. For our Year 5/6 students, we will be learning to write the date in Mandarin. We will also be learning about the things you should and should not do on the day of the Chinese New Year, for example you should not sweep the floor as in sweeping away the good luck.

## Teacher: Mrs Kristy Bedford

Students across all year levels will begin their learning in Visual Arts by exploring the Elements of Art — the foundational building blocks artists use to create and communicate ideas. These include line, shape (2D), colour and value, texture, form (3D) and space.

Students will investigate, experiment and develop skills using a range of media and techniques, including drawing, painting and printing, while expressing their creativity and growing confidence as artists.

We are very excited to be working towards our Art Show, where student learning and creativity will be celebrated and proudly showcased. To support this event, artwork created throughout the year will be carefully stored at school so they can be displayed as part of the exhibition.

We can't wait to share the wonderful work our students will create! Further information about the Art Show will be shared later in the year, closer to the event.

We also welcome clean donations for the art room, such as buttons, ice-cream container lids, magazines, old towels, cardboard tubes from foil or cling wrap packaging (please no toilet rolls), plastic bottle tops etc. that can be transformed into creative artworks.

## Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund APPLICATION Form

The CSEF is an annual payment to the school to be used towards camps, sports and/or excursion expenses for the benefit of the eligible student. The CSEF is paid directly the school and will be allocated by the school towards camps, sports and/or excursion costs for your child.

Payments for 2025 are:

- \$400 per year for eligible primary school students

Payments are made directly to the school:

- from March onwards each year where the parent/carer's concession card is assessed as valid on the first day of Term 1 and
- where the parent/carer's concession card is assessed as valid on the first day of Term 2.

Payments are for the application year and cannot be claimed for previous years.

All families who are eligible to apply for CSEF funding should collect an application for at the office and provide a copy of your valid Parent/Carer Concession Card. Applications close soon so if you have any questions, please contact Meghan on (03) 9435 1496

**REMINDER** – the Department of Education (which includes our school) **does not** have personal accident insurance for students.

*If a student is injured at school or while participating in a school activity (including offsite) and requires medical treatment, parents/carers are responsible for all of their child's medical expenses. This includes transport costs such as ambulance costs (which may include an air ambulance if considered necessary).*

**REMINDER** – the Department of Education (which includes our school) **does not** have personal property insurance for staff and/or students.

*Items of personal property that are lost, stolen or damaged at school or during school excursions are not the responsibility of Greensborough Primary School or the Department. Staff and students are reminded not to bring items of value to school or on school excursions.*

*Greensborough Primary School encourages parents/carers to consider obtaining their own accident insurance for students and property of value that may be brought to school.*



Bill’s generosity of time and his love and care for those in the local area extended beyond GPS through raising funds for many community needs through coordinating Bunnings BBQs.
