Principal’s Report

It’s hard to believe that in 2 weeks from today, it will be the last day of term, and we’ll be having our Easter Parade! Whilst this has been a very productive term with all the usual class and extracurricular programs, it has also been very challenging with the ongoing issues caused by the power surge on the eve of students’ return to school. Many of the problems have been rectified, however we are still in the process of working with the VSBA to replace air conditioners, interactive whiteboards in some classrooms, etc. and lodge insurance claims for damaged appliances. Challenges such as this, highlight how amazing our students and staff are. Classes worked with little or no lighting, power and devices that are essential teaching tools in today’s classrooms. Throughout it all staff just ‘got on with the job’ and ensured teaching and learning programs continued to be delivered at a high standard and students were engaged with their learning.

We’re looking forward to celebrating Harmony Day next Tuesday 31st and acknowledging all the different cultures in our school, recognising our diversity. Our Wellbeing Worker Robyn has included details of the day in her article later in the newsletter. Students are also eagerly preparing their Easter Bonnets for our Easter Hat Parade at 09:15am on the last day of term and practising for their events. This is always a highlight of our school year, especially the Grade 6 egg toss and egg hunt on the oval. Family members are invited to attend, and we thank families in advance for supporting your children to make their hats.

International Students March 27th and April 1st

In the next fortnight we will be hosting 2 different groups of Chinese students, as they experience life in an Australian school for a day. This fits in well with Harmony Week and is a great opportunity for further cross-cultural exchanges. Mr Derrick has organised an Aussie Rules football clinic for each group, so they have an appreciation of our much-loved game.

Industrial Action - Tuesday 24 March

The Australian Education Union has called on its members to take strike action on Tuesday 24 March 2026. At this stage I do not have information of how many staff will be taking part in the strike action. As soon as I have this information, I will advise families in a COMPASS post.

In line with DET protocols, some students may have a normal program for the day, with modifications and some may not be required to attend. If this causes any families difficulties, in particular if you are a critical services worker, please get in touch as soon as possible if your child's class is affected.

NAPLAN

Congratulations to our Grade 3 and Grade 5 students who completed NAPLAN over the last fortnight, especially with the very challenging situation of the system crashing for the Grade 5 Writing Test. This was very stressful for students and staff who were trying to rectify the problem before being advised it was a nationwide outage. I commend students and teachers for their resilience in rescheduling and completing the tests to the best of their ability. The protocols for NAPLAN testing are very different to the regular class routines as students complete work within a strict time limit and are unable to speak to classmates or ask for assistance. Whilst teachers prepare students for these conditions and practise navigating the online platform, our preparations were restricted this year due to our inability to charge our laptops when the power surge 'fried' our charging stations. This was very challenging, especially for our Grade 3 students, who needed to build on the work they began last year on transitioning from iPads to notebooks. With power being restored only 2 weeks before NAPLAN began, students only had a short window to become familiar with the new devices. Again, I commend students and staff for their determination to build their skills and their calm approach to managing the situation.

Emergency Management and Anaphylaxis Drills

Student safety is very important to us at Greensborough Primary and each term we practise emergency management drills. This includes evacuations, lock-ins and treatment of an anaphylactic reaction in the yard or classroom. Prior to our drills, teachers discuss correct procedures in a sensitive and age-appropriate manner with their grades. Each time we rehearse we commend our students on their calm, prompt responses. Our OH&S Rep, Claire E. or Anaphylaxis Coordinator Rebecca G. act as observers to our drills and complete a DET checklist so that we can acknowledge what's working well and address any areas for improvement. Whilst none of the staff have ever had to evacuate or administer an EpiPen to a student in our teaching careers, being prepared is always our best management option.

Hi Everyone!



HARMONY DAY was first celebrated in Australia in 1999. People celebrate it by reflecting on the ways they can live in harmony with their neighbours. In 1998, the government commissioned a study into the nature of racism that highlighted a greater need for people to 'live in harmony'. As a result, **Harmony Day** was created to encourage everyone to respect each other and appreciate the country's vibrant multicultural background.

How do we celebrate **Harmony Day**? **Harmony Day** is a celebration of our cultural diversity – a day of cultural respect for everyone who calls Australia home regardless of cultural or linguistic background, united by a set of core Australian values.

Held every year on 21 March, the Day coincides with the United Nations International Day for the Elimination of Racial Discrimination.




Fascinating facts – Some interesting statistics about Australia's diversity today from latest Census Data:

- 29.1% of Australia's population were born overseas.
- 51.5 % of Australian residents were born overseas (first generation) or have a parent born overseas (second generation).
- We identify with over 300 ancestries in Australia.
- 812,728 people identified as Aboriginal and/or Torres Strait Islander. This is an increase of 25.2% since 2016, representing 3.2% of the population.
- 167 Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander languages were used at home by 76,978 Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander peoples. The most widely reported language groups used were Arnhem Land and Daly River Region Languages (14.5%) and Torres Strait Island Languages (12.0%).
- Since 1945, more than 7.5 million people have migrated to Australia.
- The top five most reported ancestries included English 33.0%, Australian 29.9%, Irish 9.5%, Scottish 8.6% and Chinese 5.5%.
- Mandarin is the most common language other than English spoken in Australia with 685,274 people using Mandarin at home.
- This is followed by Arabic (367,159 people), Vietnamese (320,758 people), and Cantonese (295,281 people).
- Punjabi had the largest increase, showing 239,033 people using Punjabi at home.
- Nepali featured in the top five languages used at home in both ACT (1.3%) and Tasmania (1.3%).
- 85% of Australians agree multiculturalism has been good for Australia.

Use these tips to spark your children's curiosity about whom they (and others) are in their world:

1. I love you/我愛你/Te quiero. Teaching your children words in the native language(s) of your family is a personal way to introduce them to different cultures, as well as family history
2. Celebrating others. Children's books are wonderful resources, such as: [It's Okay to be Different](#) (diversity); [The Skin You Live In](#) (acceptance); [Same, Same But Different](#) (culture and geography); [Whoever You Are](#) (diversity);
3. Exposure to other cultures brings personal meaning. Here are more hands-on activities you can try:
 - Encourage cross-racial/ethnic/religious/ability friendships.
 - Expose your children to foods from different cultures



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- Attend different events/festivals that celebrate a particular ethnic group, holiday or personal accomplishment, like the Special Olympics, the Chinese New Year or Holi, the Hindu festival of colours.
 - Whether big or small, children's or history museums house an abundance of artefacts from different cultures and countries.
4. **The most powerful role model.** Children become culturally sensitive and respectful when they see adults who are culturally sensitive and respectful, and who take a stand against bias, racism or insensitivity.






through STEM coding




This year our grades 1-6 students celebrated Harmony Day through STEM as part of our coding lessons. Harmony Day is about celebrating our differences and respecting each other.



Recipe

Mars Bar Slice

3 Mars Bars

3 Cups of Rice Bubbles

90g of Butter (We use Nuttex)

200g of Milk Chocolate

1. Prepare your tin with baking paper
2. Melt the butter and chopped Mars Bar together. Stir thoroughly until smooth.
3. Remove from heat and add rice bubbles to mixture and stir evenly
4. Press and transfer mixture into your tin.
5. Melt the chocolate and pour over slice.
6. Set and refrigerate for 2-3 hours and cut and serve into squares.
