Diamond Valley Foodshare

Their client numbers have increased by 34% in the first 3 months of this year, when comparing to the same period last year. Due to the financial burden of increasing electricity, fuel, rent and food costs, their client numbers are growing rapidly and their donations are decreasing.

A container has been placed on a table in the foyer for families, if possible, to donate food items to support Foodshare to continue to provide a reliable and respectful food relief service to the community of Banyule and Nillumbik. 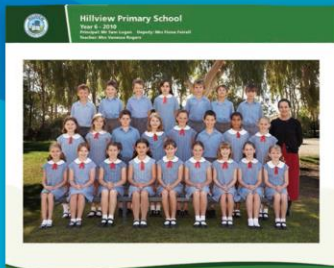

Specialist SPOTLIGHT

Specialist Spotlight highlights the learning our students engage in beyond the classroom, including Physical Education, Library, STEM, Mandarin and Art. These specialist subjects enrich classroom learning and support creativity, movement, curiosity, language and a love of learning.



Teacher: Mr Leo Derrick

In Term 2, students will continue to build on the fundamental movement skills developed in Term 1 through Basketball, the Football Clinic, and Bat and Ball. These prior experiences will support students in further developing their coordination, confidence, and ability to apply skills in more structured and game-based environments.

This term, the focus will shift to Tee Ball and Netball, where students will refine their striking, throwing, passing, and movement into space. There will be a strong emphasis on teamwork, communication, and decision-making during gameplay. Students will also participate in Cross Country and continue their involvement in Interschool Sport (ISS). We are hopeful that, as in Term 1, several teams will progress through to finals, reflecting the effort and development shown across all year levels.



Teacher: Ms Rebecca Gauci

Here's what we're looking forward to in the library this term:

In Prep, students will explore books by noticing characters and events and making connections to their own lives. They will also learn how to care for books and follow library routines.

Across Years 1 and 2, students will develop their ability to talk about texts by sharing opinions, explaining their thinking, and listening to others. They will also explore how illustrations add meaning and help bring stories to life. Our 3/4 cohort will explore a range of fiction texts, discovering how authors and illustrators shape stories in different ways. They will share their responses and practise supporting their ideas with examples from the text.

In Years 5/6, students will explore a range of texts and examine how history, culture, and society influence ideas. They will make connections between what they read, their own experiences, and the wider world.

Teacher: Mrs Leah Ryan

This term in STEM, students across all year levels will be exploring exciting learning experiences linked to Chemical Science. Our prep students will be introduced to materials, the way they feel and how we choose different products to suit our needs. Such as warm, fluffy clothes in winter and waterproof jacket when it rains. Year 1 and 2 students will make predictions about combining materials for different purposes. Students will look at how different proportions of materials can affect outcomes. Students in Years 3 and 4 will explore materials properties and design and create an object or structure for a specific purpose. Years 5 and 6 students will delve into the properties of matter-solids, liquids and gases. They will also investigate mixtures.

Years 1–6, students will also learn about how these topics have impacted the lives of Indigenous Australians. To conclude term 2, students will continue to develop their coding skills, this time using our Dash robots, our connecting apps and participating in different age-related challenges.



Teacher: Mr Han Hung

Ni hao (that's hello in Mandarin)! It is going to be a fantastic Term 2 in Mandarin. We are very excited to be starting a Mandarin program. Primary years are important years to be immersed in another language and culture; we look forward to continuing our learning about all things Chinese this year through the use of mini games, song and dance.

For our Year 3/4 students, we will be learning about being able to talk about the various emergency people to call in China and the vehicle they are in to deliver essential services.

For our Year 5/6 students, we will be learning about the fantastic ways people travel around China in the past and present.

Teacher: Mrs Kristy Bedford

This term in Visual Arts, students across all year levels will explore the Elements of Art — line, shape, colour, texture, value and form — through a range of creative, hands-on experiences. Foundation students will build foundational skills through drawing, painting, collage

and simple construction, with a focus on colour, shape and texture. Grade 1/2 students will develop their understanding of these elements through mixed media artworks, sculpture and fibre art, including weaving and sewing, while developing skills in expressing ideas and discussing their artworks.

Grade 3/4 students will extend their skills through more complex processes such as cardboard construction, sewing and reflective artworks, applying techniques to communicate meaning and create detail. Grade 5/6 students will refine their skills through graphic design, metal embossing and observational drawing, using more advanced techniques to develop composition, form and visual impact. Across all year levels, students will create a range of artworks that will contribute to the school Art Show, celebrating creativity, skill development and individual expression.

Celebrating Positive Behaviour with Class Dojo

After a trial period last year, our school is excited to introduce a new way of recognising and celebrating positive behaviour across our classrooms using ClassDojo.

This initiative is part of our ongoing work with School Wide Positive Behaviour Support (SWPBS), a framework that focuses on explicitly teaching, encouraging and recognising positive behaviours that help create a safe, respectful and supportive learning environment for all students.



How It Works

Teachers will award Dojo points to students when they demonstrate our school's expected behaviours and values, such as showing respect, care, perseverance and being ready to learn.

Points are awarded using ClassDojo, allowing teachers to provide immediate recognition and positive feedback when students demonstrate these behaviours.

Working Together as a Class

In addition to recognising individual students, each student's points contribute to their class total. When the class collectively reaches a set number of points, the class earns a whole class reward.

The point targets are:

- Prep: 100 points
- Grade 1/2: 100 points
- Grade 3/4: 150 points
- Grade 5/6: 200 points

When a class reaches their goal, they will celebrate with a class reward, such as a class game, 15-20 minutes of free choice activities.

Encouraging Positive Behaviour

The aim of this system is to:

- Encourage and celebrate positive behaviour
- Build a strong sense of teamwork within classes
- Reinforce our shared school values and expectations
- Create a positive and supportive learning environment

We will be using a "free and frequent" approach, meaning teachers will regularly acknowledge students demonstrating positive behaviours throughout the day.

Working in Partnership

We encourage families to talk with their children about the positive behaviours they are demonstrating at school and to celebrate their efforts. Together, we can continue building a school culture where cooperation, achievement, respect, and empathy, together with our clear school expectations, are recognised and valued. As part of our School Wide Positive Behaviour Support approach, this system will be monitored and reviewed over time to ensure it is supporting positive outcomes for all students.

We look forward to celebrating many positive moments with our students.
